RED PAPER CHIDES SOVIET ON JEWS

Yiddish Organ Here Rebukes Moscow Press Aide Who Denied Anti-Semitism

The Morning Freiheit, Yiddishlanguage Communist newspaper of New York, rebuked the press chief of the Soviet Foreign Ministry yesterday for his attitude toward a report of anti-Semitism in the Soviet Union.

The press chief, Leonid F. Ilyichev, had branded as "slanderous and anti-Soviet" an article on Soviet anti-Semitism that appeared last April in the Folksshtime, Yiddish-language Communist newspaper of Warsaw. His statement, given to a Moscow correspondent of the National Guardian, a leftist New York weekly, was the first official Soviet reaction to the Polish report, which aroused wide interest in many countries.
