in Paris, Vienna and Rome yesterday broke the news about the Khrushchev speech to their readers for the first time, trying, however, to soften the blow. In Rome, the Italian Commu-

nist paper L'Unita printed a Moscow dispatch that Khrushchev gave a secret report Feb. 25 on "The Cult of Personality and its Consequences." It declared this speech had given a "detailed analysis of Stalin's activity with his merits and his errors."
