Effort to Oust Gates as Editor of Worker Starts Fight for Party Control

Internal discord is raging more bitterly than ever in the American Communist party, sources close to the party declared yes-

terday.

The public show of unity made at the end of last month's Communist national convention has been dissipated, these sources said. Instead, a bitter battle is taking place between the factions headed by William Z. Foster and by John Gates for control of the party's national committee. That control will be determined by the outcome of regional elections to the committee now taking place.

Some Negro leaders of the party, particularly Benjamin J. Davis Jr., associated with the Foster group, are said to be using the Jewish issue particularly, relating it to what they deem to be the inadequate support being given to Egypt in The Daily Worker's handling of the Egyptian-Israeli dispute. Davis is reported to have been the individual who introduced the resolution to oust Gates as Daily Worker editor.

Some sympathizers with Gates charged that the effort to oust him had been inspired by hope that Gates' supporters would become so disgusted that they would drop out of the party and leave its control in the hands of the Foster faction. Significant party losses are reported to have taken place in recent weeks, particularly of "liberals" who would have backed Gates if they had remained.

The party balance of power is now reported to be held by a centrist group headed by Eugene Dennis, former general secretary of the party. Mr. Dennis is reported to have voted against the ouster of Gates at last week's meeting and thus to have swung the balance against the Foster-
