BROOKLYN CHAIRMAN OF REDS RESTORED

The New York state committee of the Communist party has restored Charles Loman to his job as Kings County chairman. There were some indications yesterday that the restoration might be temporary.

ration might be temporary. Mr. Loman, a member of the party's national committee, had been suspended from the job Jan. 7 by the state board. The announced ground was that he had taken an "extended trip, leaving his positions of responsibility without discharging his official obligations to the state and national committees."

Mr. Loman later returned, and was reported to have participated in a meeting of the state committee that first upheld the action of the state board in suspending him, then lifted the suspension.

The committee's report was published in The Worker, Communist weekly, under a Feb. 8 date. It said the committee had "referred to the state board and the Kings County committee Loman's work, as well as the preparation of a statement for the 'political and ideological clarification and education of the party.'"
