Nick Dozenberg

Dear Comrade:

Maurice Becker, who as you know has been doing a lot of work for us and who has stood by us at a time when the other cartoonists had nearly all deserted, and who furthermore has been patient and uncomplaining of the long months of failure to pay him, now writes to me that he is dead broke and very much in need of some of the money we owe him. I suggest that if it is in the least possible to send him something, it ought to be done quickly. I can't emphasize too strongly the fact that he has been extremely patient and enthusiastic in working for both the magazine and the *Daily [Worker]*, and although he has to live, he has never pressed us before for money.

Please let him know what you do about it.
