COMPANY-UNIONS SWARM WITH CORPORATION SPIES

By ROBERT W. DUNN (Federated Press) Labor spies and company unions are complementary devices used against trade unions by many American corporations.

In Passaic, N. J., detectives and company unionism have been cooperating to liquidate trade unionism. Other great American corporations where the spy and the "newer methods of labor control" have been used without any suggestion of inconsistency are many of the railroads, such as the Pennsylvania, the Santa Fe, the Union Pacific, the Delaware and Lackawanna, the Long Island, the Boston and Maine, the Pittsburgh and Lake Erie, the Atlantic Coast Line, the Great Northern and the New York, New Haven and Hartford.

PRUSSIAN STATE MINES TO BE MADE A BASE FOR SOCIALISM

To develop from the present state-owned coal mines in Prussia a form of public ownership that will expand and absorb other industries and improve methods until it will represent real socialism, or industrial democracy, is the plan of the state organization now operating these mines, which is largely controlled by Socialists, according to H. S. Raushenbush, secretary of the Committee on Coal and Power, an American organization.

"Prussia, which is a state comparable in importance to New York State in the East, has had mining properties for many years and by underletting the prices of the private companies effected a sort of consumer socialism. Nevertheless, it seems to have been, according to the criticism of Social Democrats who are now actively in control of the Prussian mining industry, bureaucratic, without much initiative or freedom of action or development of responsibility.

"All this transformation was simply to secure the initiative and responsibility which it was felt private industry had. The company (Preussag) is under the control of the State. It cannot sell any stock without the approval of the legislature and must make a yearly financial report to it. It is believed by those Social Democrats in charge that the change is more than proving its value. The civil service rules do not apply to those who were not formerly in government service and to those who were it only applied until 1928. This change to a stock company with greater freedom of action and absence of legislative interference was done under great duress. During the war the government mines had suffered more than the private ones. Production per man day was down 30 to 40 per cent of the prewar rate.
