

SEEK EUROPEAN WAR TO HALT SOCIALISM

Socialism is facing its greatest hour of combat with the tottering thrones of Europe, bulwarked by the capitalist enemies of the organized workers.

European capitalism is fomenting the pending pan-European campaign of wholesale murder as its only hope of checking, crushing and stamping out the continually growing and increasingly formidable rebellion against

If this carnival of carnage is averted it will be the achievement of International Socialism. No other power has raised its hand to stay the wanton slaughter. If this approaching horror, this blood-letting, this suffering, this attempted blow at civilization is checked at its start, then the unity of toil will have once more successfully

Nearly two years ago at the Extraordinary International Socialist Peace Congress held at Basil, Switzerland, during the Balkan War, the bloody fingers of antihumanity were seen streaking their hope for war in unmistakable letters across a reddening sky.

The declaration of this congress, Nov. 24-25, 1912, which stayed this war hope for nearly two years, was as follows:

"The Socialist parties of Austria-Hungary, Croatia, Slavonia and Herzegovinia must continue with all their strength their hitherto successful efforts to prevent any attack of the Austrian monarchy upon Servia. They must continue to oppose in the future as they have done

up to the present any attempt to take by violence from Servia the fruits of war and to transform that country into an Austrian province and to embroil the peoples of Austria-Hungary and other nations of Europe in conflict in the interests of the ruling dynasty. The Socialists of Austria-Hungary will have to struggle in the future in favor of securing a complete autonomous democratic government for the whole of the Southern Slavs, now governed by the Hapsburg dynasty within the frontiers

of Austria-Hungary."

Thus the International Socialist movement spoke. Servia is a haven of hope ir Southern Europe. The liberties won by its peoples mater the cruel oppression of the dual monarchy of Austra-Hungary as the freedom achieved by the United States challenges middle-aged Russia.

The South Slavs dream of a South Slavic republic The Servians join in this dream and strive to make the dream real. Such success would mean the wreckage of Europe's trembling thrones and the scrapping of its ty-

It would mean the toiling masses, more united and more unshackled, approaching near to their emancipation, wage slavery a thing passing, and capitalism being abolished from the earth. Hence the effort to crush and

annihilate Servia. On the eve of the approaching conflict the International Socialist Bureau has been ordered to gather immediately at Brussels, Belgium, with the assemblage of the World's Socialist Congress at Vienna, the capital of the belligerent monarchy, less than one month away.

The Italian Socialists have issued a statement declaring that war would be useless and demanding the immediate convocation of Parliament to give the government an opportunity to guarantee that there will be no war, whatever happens.

Immediately the storm clouds broke, the German Socialists issued calls for mass meetings, their watchword being, "Down With War." Risking their lives, Socialists spread broadcast copies of Vorwaerts, the Berlin Socialist daily, freely mingling with the war-insane retainers of capitalism. German workers refused to doff their caps to huge portraits of Emperor Francis Joseph and Kaiser Wilhelm carried in procession by the bloodcrazed enemies of progress.

Twenty-five thousnd toilers made the streets of Paris alive with their manifestations against war which 2.000 police and a regiment of soldiers were unable to

On the eve of this pending catastrophe to humanity Russia is facing a strike of 200,000 workers centered in its own capital of St. Petersburg; France is on the verge of a political upheaval, and Great Britain is threatened with civil war in Ulster.

It is felt that should the Italian government dare to issue an order of mobilization to help Austria, it is certain that a general revolution will break forth and upset the monarchy.

This is the situation as the Triple Alliance (Italy, Austria-Hungary, Germany) and the Triple Entente (Russia, France, England) are seeking to array one-half of Europe against the other half. The big question is, "Will the workers, led and inspired by those of their number organized into the Socialist party and the trade unions, permit themselves to be ted to the shambles and sacrificed on the altar of greed in order that capitalism might endure for yet a few years?"

With its membership of 100,000 and its voting strength of one million men, the American Socialist party should be a factor in stifling this Moloch's cry for blood. This nation is the home of men of every nationality. Representatives of the nations of Europe are to be found in every city, town and hamlet. The American Socialists can everywhere call mass meetings of peoples of all these nationalities, have good speakers decry the futility of hatred of man for man, and point out the brotherhood of all.

Europe's monarchs look to the United States for recruits to their human slaughter house. American Socialism should see that no victim crosses the seas in the mistaken hope that he is helping himself by going to his grave fighting the battles of European capitalism.

THE BUTTE AFFAIR REVIEWED

HE assault upon the Butte Miners' Union, the wrecking of its hall by dynamite and the looting of its safe by its own members, coupled with the riot which followed between the two factions into which the union had been torn, egged on by a vicious element imported for that special purpose, has made June 23 a memorable date in the annals of the labor

There is much in this deplorable affair that is still wrapped in mystery, but enough is known to warrant the general conclusion that the Butte Miners' Union has long been marked for destruction and that its enemies have for months been conspiring to deliver the coup that should put an end to its existence.

HAS DECIDED VIEWS.

This argument is of great service in strength-ening minds that see in the home the colvent of a service of the service of the political party that threatens the home, no matter what its claim to social

service, must be looked on as anti-social,

But it may well be asked, has the home not already been threatened? But it may well be asked, has the home not already been threatened? Indeed, have the threats not been too well realized, and are not great masses of the workfolk wholly homeless? A room or two, overcrowded with inmates cannot be called a home. A house in such conditions and in such surroundings that the infant mortality is twice or thrice as much as in well-to-do neighborhoods cannot be called a home. Yet the recent bluebook on the housing of Great Britain and Ireland has an eloquence of statistics proving that the homes of our country are not merely threatened, but vigorously attacked and undermined.

Moreover, to repeat the argument of the previous section, woman's work has largely taken wives from their own homes and made them wives but not mothers. This is to destroy the home.

Now, this again, is not a future evil to be dreaded; it is such a rooted present evil that any whole-hearted efforts to uproot it are like to offer the features of a revolution.

Yet again, not Socialism, but some other political or industrial policy has set up almost unnoticed this enemy of the home.

OTHER RIGHTS.

5. Lastly, and this is perhaps the most urgent of all the pleas against Socialism, it is said that Socialism would destroy the inborn and inalienable

right of property.

But if the right of property means not that some men shall own all property, but that all men shall own some property, one asks: "Where is this right of property existing in the world of today?" Is the inalienable right of property kept in a state of things where vast numbers of worktolk have not a square yard of land and are never more than a month from destitution? Is this inalienable right a fact in a state of things where, by the testimony of a pope, "a small number of very rich men have been able to lay upon the teeming masses of the laboring poor a yoke little better than that of slavery itseli," and where there are two which differing castes . . . one which holds power because it holds wealth and which has in its grasp the whole of labor and trade; on the other side there is the needy and power'ess multitude, broken down and suffering," so that "some remedy must be found, and found quickly, for the misery (i. e., want) and wretchedness pressing so heavily and so unjustly on the vast majority of the working classes." (Rerum Novarum.) right of property.

(Rerum Novarum.) It is evident that this state of injustice whereby the vast majority o It is evident that this state of injustice whereby the vast majority of the working classes are in a position of misery is not exactly a state based on the right of property. For injustice is the forcible taking or holding of property. And it is evident that the state, based on the violent interference with the right of property, is not in any measure due to the political party called Socialism. It must therefore be due, either in its rise or maintenance, to the other political parties which Catholics freely enter without dread

As was said at the outset, this line of thought is not meant nor perhaps As was said at the outset, this interior thought is not meant nor perhaps even fitted to be a defense of Socialism. It is merely an observed and recorded fact for the guidance of social thinkers. If a social thinker retues absolution to a member of the Socialist party because the Socialist party would bring in a state of things, my does he not refuse absolution to members of the other political parties, for this state of things is already in existence and has been brought about or, at least, is being upheld by them?

It is evident therefore that there is some flaw in the course of reasoning

which would withhold absolution on a probability and give it on a fact. Either the premises are not observed facts or the reasoning is amiss.

For the moment our task is to point out that somewhere there is a flaw in the chain of reasoning, with the hope that social thinkers will revise either their facts or their deductions.




