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WHAT HAVE YOU DONE TO STOP WAR?

WHAT HAVE you done to crush the growing war mania of the patriots for profits? Did you write to President Wilson and tell him that you positively refuse to fight for Morgan and Schwab and their crowd? Did you tell him that if we are plunged into war it will be a war to enrich only the munitions ring and the food speculators? Did you tell him that you clearly see thru the thin veneer and that the plea to protect American lives is only a hollow mockery? Did you tell him that you see the dollar behind every word uttered by the kept pro-war press that is thirsting for human blood? Protest against "Armed Neutrality" for it is inviting war to America. If you have not done so, do it at once, before it is too late.

The bloated and bleary-eyed vultures who want war are without scruples and would turn you out as cannon meat to swell their blood-soaked coffers. There are members in the United States and the House who stand by the people and against war. Your letters will strengthen them in their opposition to the professional mass murder that the profit-mongers yearn for. The common people do not want war because they know that those who have the most to fight for will not fight.

IS THERE anyone feeble minded enough to believe that Morgan, Schwab and Rockefeller will enter the trenches? Is there anyone at large, who for one

moment thinks that the Wall street crowd will shoulder a gun and fight "to protect American lives"? Is there anyone who even believes that the Wall Street gluttons will go to the firing line to defend THEIR commerce? If they are too cowardly to go to the front to protect their commerce, why should you?

The "Bought And Paid For" press tricked the workers to the trenches in 1898. At that time we were aroused to avenge the blowing up of the Maine. Imbued with a patriotic frenzy, thousands went to Cuba and the Philippines. The common people were blinded by the press so they could see nothing but "Remember the Maine!" In 1916, eighteen years later, the war office at Washington issued a document in which we find the following: (War Dept. Document No. 528, page 6.) "When it became evident to our Military Information Division in 1897 that war was certain to occur between the United States and Spain, an attempt was made to discover not only the numbers but the Garrisons of the Spanish Army in Cuba." So you see, it was "certain in 1897," not in 1898 when the Maine was blown up, that we would have war with Spain. The war lords knew the year previous that war was "certain" but did they tell you so? You were a dead letter until the pretext for war was found and then your patriotism was appealed to just as now. Thousands went to Cuba to be fed on and killed by embalmed beef! Isn't that a marvelous recompense for defending your country?

IN THE present crisis, act after act

has been staged to enflame your passion. So far they have failed to work you up to the proper frenzy. They tried the Lusitania but you balked. Then the Frey, the Sussex, etc. Recently the Laconia and still the great mass of the people keep calm and self-possessed. Like a thunderbolt out of a clear sky came the German-Japanese-Mexican "Plot". Whether this is the trump card, remains to be seen. At any rate we cannot rest one moment in our opposition to war. We must make war on war every moment of the day. Not with sword and cannon but with reason.

Suppose that everything the press has told us about the Zimmermann Note is true. Put this government in the place of either the Allies or the Central Powers. Wouldn't our war lords embroil other countries if it suited their purpose? This country would resort to every means conceivable to crush an enemy. If it did not, it would have no business engaging in the profession of war. In 1898 we sent out modern battle-ships to shoot a lot of Spanish tubs to pieces and drown the half-starved Spaniards like rats. We had them 3000 miles from home and pommelled them in true American style.

ENGLAND, thru Morgan, has had a strange hold on this nation ever since the outbreak of the war. We have been the cow that England has milked to further her purpose. England has interfered with our commerce and is still doing so with her superdreadnoughts. Germany is doing it with her submarines.

To us the Kaiser with his military

machine and submarines should be as despicable as Lloyd George and his super-dreadnoughts and the Czar and his cossacks.

We should be for neither side--we should be against both and while we are ranting against the military and naval terrorism of the Kaiser, the Treasury of this nation is being looted to build up a murder machine to force the surplus values created by the workers of this country upon people of other lands.

"We must have the biggest Navy in the world," is the cry, and the industrial pirates are determined to have it--no matter what the cost may be to us.

AND WHAT about protecting American lives? There is a wonderful field here at home to practice that.

From 1890 to 1913 there were 31,710 miners reported killed in the soft coal mines of this country. In addition to this, according to available records, 17,902 were killed in the hard coal mines from 1870 to 1913. In Cherry, Ill., 259 were killed at one time because the mine was operated in violation of law. About 1,000 were killed in the Iroquois Theatre fire in Chicago which was operated in violation of law. Nearly 1,000 went to their death on the Eastland, here in the Chicago river because the boat was unseaworthy. Over one hundred girls were burned to death in the Triangle shirt factory in New York because the law was violated. And there are numerous other instances.

Of course, that ruthless sacrifice was all due to "accidents". That is quite a convenient word to hide the shame of the nation.

LET US begin protecting lives in the industries of this country before makin any hypocritical pretenses in the present war crisis. The only thing the workers can expect out of war is to be crippled or killed. Should you be lucky enough to be missed by bullets and shells and get a medal for bravery, remember that neither your merchant, butcher, doctor nor land lord will accept it in payment of bills. No matter how brave you prove yourself in defense of the country, when you return home you will still be exploited and oppressed and you will be forced to take out a bare existence.

I repeat, act before it is too late. Let the president and the members of congress know where you stand. Tell them that neither the nation's integrity, honor or independence is in danger. Tell them that you refuse to murder your brother of any country and then hide your crimsoned fist in the folds of the flag.

ACT QUICK! Arouse your neighbor and fellow worker to the seriousness of the situation for the cost of war will be tremendous. "Armed Neutrality" is a direct invitation to war.

The Socialist Party must stand like a stone wall against the disaster that will be ours unless we organize and act in unison. Close up the ranks everywhere and add to our columns those who vote the Socialist ticket but have not yet joined the party!

ORGANIZE OR PAY THE PENALTY THAT PLUTOCRACY WILL METE OUT TO YOU FOR YOUR NEGLIGENCE!

Tom Mooney Sentenced To Hang An Appeal To The Organized Workers Of America!

A TELEGRAM just received from San Francisco announces the sentence of Tom Mooney. He is to hang by the neck until he is dead. The day set for his murder is May 17th. The capitalist jury and judge have done their foul work, and it is now up to us to do ours.

Tom Mooney is an absolutely innocent man and his conviction an infamous crime. We, the workers of America, are duty bound to challenge the verdict of the capitalist jury and set aside the sentence of the capitalist judge. We constitute a court, a jury, and a judge of our own.

We sat thru this case from the hour the vile conspiracy was concocted and we know beyond doubt that Mooney was framed and that he is to be murdered for no other reason than that the corporation criminals, the big capitalist thieves and their official highbinders could not buy him, or silence his agitation.

MORE THAN twenty reputable witnesses not only testified to Mooney's innocence but proved it beyond even the shadow of a doubt. His alibi was without a flaw. He was miles away from the bomb when it exploded in the preparedness parade. He had absolutely no connection with and no knowledge of the affair. Bourke Cochran, the eminent New York lawyer, who defended him, is positively convinced of this and so is every other man or woman who attended the trial and is not in the pay or under the influence of the United Railroads, the Manufacturers' Association, and other red-handed bandits who have for years been plundering San Francisco and have now set themselves up as the autocratic rulers of the Pacific coast.

You know the record of the Manufacturers' Association. You remember the Mulhall story and the trail of this slimy serpent in the investigation at Washington. If the law had been enforced every one of these criminal conspirators would now be keeping the lock-step in penitentiary.

You know, too, the rotten record of the United Railroads, every page of which drips with corruption and reeks with stench that cry to heaven. You also know the attitude of the Chamber of Commerce of San Francisco, that gang of pot-bellied exploiters and thieves and their mangy spaniels. It is these sweet-scented elements that constitute the despotic power that rules San Francisco with a rod of steel, these private interests organized for loot, rapine, and plunder, as conscienceless a gang of pirates as ever sandbagged an honest man or picked the pocket of a blind orphan.

AND IT is this gang that issued its declaration of war against organized labor and in cold blood set to work thru its slenchs, hirelings and prostitutes, male and female, of high and low degree,

to drive every union man and woman and every Socialist from the Pacific coast.

This is the real cause, the true inwardness of Tom Mooney's conviction. He would not lay down like a cur at the command of the bleary-eyed, bloated bandits. He stood up like a man and defied them. In every protest of the workers Mooney's voice was heard; in every strike he was at the front and his influence was felt. He was true in every throb of his heart to the organized workers in their battle against annihilation. He lost sight of self entirely. He was the kind of a man when the crisis came we should have a thousand of instead of one, and if we had, those broadcloth, bediamonded, greasy desperadoes who are now trying to assassinate him under cover of law would have seen ignominious finish long ago.

THE ARREST of Mooney in connection with the bomb explosion was an outrage, his trial from first to last a farce, and his conviction and sentence a crime so flagrant, so cruel, so shocking that the working class of the whole nation should and must rise in revolt against it.

The plundering plutocrats thirsting to lap Tom Mooney's honest blood must be thwarted. These hyenas shall not break his neck and gloat over his dead body. Their infamous court and its filthy hirelings have brought him bound and gagged to the gallows but they shall not chortle over his ghastly murder.

COMRADES and fellow-workers of America, I appeal to you! If ever my voice was heard I want it to be heard now. If ever I was engaged in an act of duty to justice and service to the working class I am engaged in that act now in pleading with you to help save as honest a workingman and as true a unionist as ever stood under the banner of the labor movement.

I know Tom Mooney and I know him well. For weeks he was with us on the Red Special. We ate and slept together. Every one on the train loved him. To me he was a younger brother. He is innocent. I swear it. His murder would be a foul and indelible blot upon our movement and an everlasting disgrace to ourselves.

We can save him. We have got to save him. Let us get to work and lose no time. From now on my pen and my voice are at his service. My duty is clear and so is that of every other union man and Socialist in America.

FIRST OF all there is the most urgent need for funds. Everyone should contribute at least his mite. Send your contribution at once to Robert Minor, Room 210, Russ Bldg., San Francisco, Cal. But this is not all. We must get busy at our union and local meetings. Publicity is extremely important. Protest meetings should be at once organized and proper action taken. We can stir the country from end to end before the San Francisco hangmen in evening dress can dislocate the neck of their framed-up victim.

Every labor union and every Socialist local must swing into line.

This is the hour for solidarity. Now is the time to stand up straight on our hind legs all over this country and say, IT SHALL NOT BE DONE!

We are patient and long suffering but there is a limit. It has been reached. Let us show this country that labor is alive. Let its lightning strike just once and there will be a sudden halt in the murder program scheduled for May 17th.

Comrades, the red blood in you must now prove itself. I pledge myself to you in this fight to its finish.

War And Wall Street

Perhaps some light is thrown on the extraordinary war fever which has seized the metropolitan press by the following "daily market letter" issued by a Wall Street broker, George Graham Rice. This letter does not discuss "rights" or "national duties" but its explanation of the response of the stock market to the threat of war is blunt to a degree and should be kept in mind; it is the key to the pressure now being steadily exerted upon the administration to plunge us into war. Pressure equal and opposite MUST be exerted. The letter follows:

"When on Saturday at 11:15 a. m. the news was flashed that Ambassador Bernstorff had been handed his passports, uncertainty changed to certainty, and the stock markets began a recovery. Today the rise was continued....

"The situation in a nutshell, as expressed by the highest banking authorities, is about like this:

"We are on the verge of war with several of the great nations of the world. These nations are 'cribbed, cabined and confined' by the navies and armies of such powerful governments as England, France and Italy. The American nation is, in fact, about to enter upon a national joyfest. This country, with its untold resources, richer than any other country in the world, is about to engage in war with nations of the first class and enjoy all the thrills of war without being compelled to do any of the real fighting. We shall now place ourselves upon a war footing equal to that of any of the warring parties, and with only the remotest possibility of an invading army or an invading navy reaching our shores. To place ourselves in a proper position, we are about to spend \$2,000,000,000 or more of American money, and spend it at home....

"In fine, overnight, \$2,000,000,000 worth of new home buying has come into existence, and the buying power from abroad which recently has been looked upon as pinchbeck, now becomes the genuine article. Unbounded prosperity is at hand. Practically everything that is needed for war purposes in this country can be supplied in this country, and the government's treasure, which will be poured into the lap of producers and manufacturers will remain here.

"Posterity may pay the debt in increased taxation and prosperity may feel the burden, but at this time the country and its flourishing population are bound to feel the quick and full effect of the unloosening."

Which is just another way of saying:

"After us the deluge!"

To Buck's surprise these dogs manifested no jealousy toward him. They seemed to share the kindness and largeness of John Thornton.

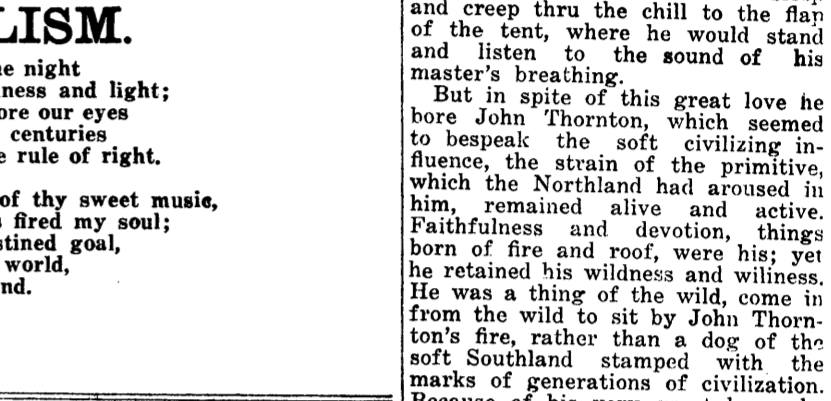

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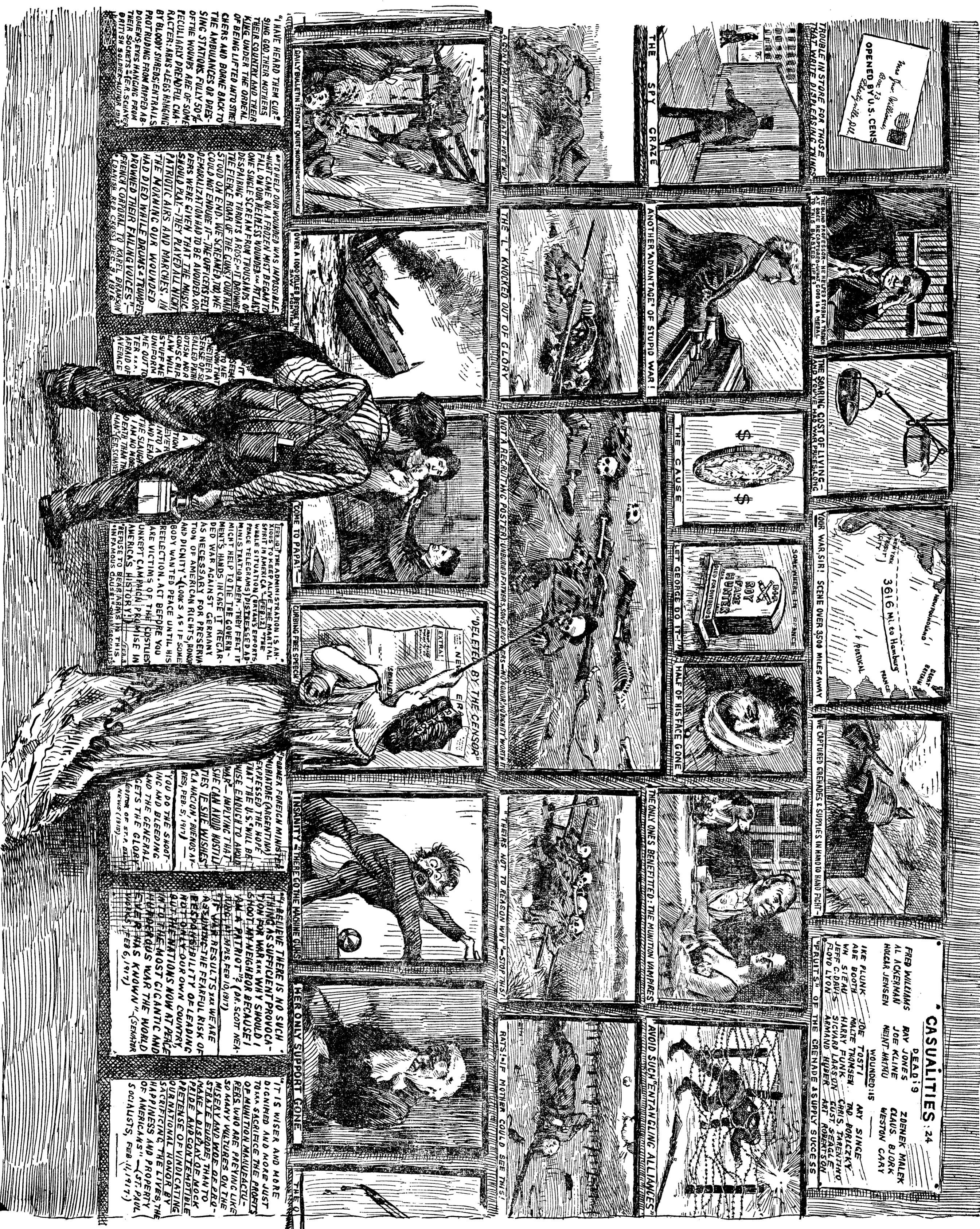
