

Resolution on the "United Front"

1. The political and security campaigns which the State of Israel has been involved in since the 6 Day War, require the consolidation of the Zionist-Socialist workers' parties for the struggle for security and peace, for the advancement of the process of the ingathering of the exiles, for the preservation of a progressive economic regime, and for a guaranteeing of the hegemony of the worker and pioneering forces in the State.

A common appearance in the Histadrut is possible, if a program can be agreed upon, which will suitably cover the basic principles of our independent appearance in the Histadrut and the Chevrat Haovdim (Worker's Economy).

Mapam will preserve its ideological, political and organizational independence.

2. The Congress empowers the institutions of the party to negotiate with the Israeli Labour Party on the basis of the preceding points. The results of the negotiations will be brought before a special session of the Congress.

The Congress confirms the agreements ratified in the negotiations with the Labour Party to establish the alliance between the two Parties.
