

From Stalin: A Political Biography Oxford U. Press 1949 (book jacket)

Isaac Deutscher, a specialist in Russian affairs since 1926, has been a brilliant contributor to both the London Observer and The Economist. Born near Cracow in 1907, he lived in Poland until 1939, when he went to London as a correspondent for Polish newspapers. In Warsaw he was active as a literary critic, economist, and a political publicist and had the opportunity to travel in Russia and in the Ukraine.

Mr. Deutscher has been a member of the editorial staff of The Economist since 1942, working in various capacities, including that of chief European and military correspondent, but mainly as an expert on Russia. From 1942 through 1946 he was also on the staff of the Observer as a special writer on diplomatic affairs and roving correspondent in Europe. In addition, under the pen name of "Peregrine," he wrote a popular weekly feature, European Notebook. He was also the author of many Profiles of outstanding European personalities.

In addition to his work for The Economist and the Observer, Mr. Deutscher has broadcast for the B.B.C. Third Programme, mainly on Russian affairs, and has lectured for the Royal Institute of International Affairs. He has also contributed articles to The Times of London and The New York Times.

At present he is engaged on work on a Social History of Soviet Russia and on two more biographies, Trotsky in Exile and Lenin, which, together with Stalin, will form a trilogy. He is also preparing material on modern Russian history for the new edition of the Cambridge Modern History.
