# Chicago Mass Protest Rally Challenges Police Terror

### Investigation Of Brutalities Is Demanded

Haywood Cheered as He Calls for Renewed Struggle for Rights

CHICAGO, Ill., Sept. 8,—"Our demonstration of more than 10,000 Negro and white opponents of fascist war against Ethiopia was a brilliant success, showing that the people of Chicago are ready to unite against war and fascism, and in defense of their basic right to speak for peace," declared Harry Haywood, Negro Communist leader, amid prolonged appliause and cheer-wood of the strength of that bill.
