A. F. of L. MUM ON-LEAKSVILLE 11% WAGE-CUT

LEAKESVILE, N. C .- Over three thousand workers at the textile mills of Draper, Spray and Leaksville received a wage-ccut averaging 11 percent last Monday, following the promises of the local organizers of the A. F. of L. United Textile Workers that there would be no strikes.

Wage-cuts and victimization of union members have occurred in the mills at Greensboro and the three mills towns here, where the A. F. of L. is active. Acting on the complete sell-out policy announced by William Green, the local officials and organizers are really helping the bosses put across their wage cuts by doing all in their power to keep the workers from



Workers' Defense groups successfully beat back the continuous police and gangster attack on the meeting. From the very start of the demonstration police on foot and on motorcycle attempted to break up the meeting but the workers succeeded for one hour.
