

Jail Another Marine Organizer in Orleans

NEW ORLEANS, La. — With the recent arrest of Angelo Herndon, Negro organizer for the Marine Workers' Industrial Union, the ship owners and the police are trying to drive the militant labor organizations underground.

Comrade Herndon was arrested on May 8 on the waterfront when he visited ships to recruit members for the Marine Workers' Industrial Union. He was picked up by a gang of police and charged with inciting to riot, no visible means of support and violating the federal injunction. Eugene Braxton, Young Communist League organizer, was arrested a few days previously on the same charges.

Herndon is now free under \$150 bond. On the basis of no evidence no action was taken against him in the federal court. Braxton was re-arrested on federal charges after being released from the police court.
