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Dear comrade Browder:

Copy to Harry Jackson.

I would to take up a few important points with you concerning the work here in Atlanta,

First, I have taken up with comrade Jackson several times, the question of sending some comrade to Atlanta, to help out in the work, this comrade to be white, since it is difficult for me to get around to all of the white connections we have, due to Race discrimination here. The comrade who are supposed to help me out in the work, Max Weitzman who is a very rotten comrade and you can't get him to do a damn thing, this question have been taken up with comrade Jackson time after time, and comrade Jackson know well of the kind of element this comrade is, and every time he come to Atlanta, this comrade polishes every thing up and time comrade Jackson leaves he begin to start his usual line of getting out of doing work, and beside this to hinder the work from continuing this comrade Jackson know about but still nothing has been did about it.

For instance no later than yesterday we had a meeting, some comrades and at this meeting we decide on how to distribute some leaflets to the Ex-Service Men who are making up to go to Washington, and this comrade was telling other workers that they should go out and distribute leaflets as well as them, "then he said "if you comrades want me to go out with you its OK" such rotten bureaucratic methods of work will drive all workers away from us as fast as we can recruit them. The Ex-Service Men was having a meeting at the State Capitol and the arrangements were that all of us to appear there at a certain time, and comrade Weitzman never did show up until now, so my self and some more white and negro comrades had to distribute the leaflets, and these workers was very much sore as HELL which we can not blame them for. It is evidently a fact that such comrade as this will not be of any value to the movement and no body else and this comrade Jackson know, but he always say that we can use him for something and when it come to the point where he wont do nothing then we will drop him, but it is a question now that he are not doing any thing and are doing all he can to keep any thing from being done. Enclosed find a copie of the leaflet that we distributed last night.

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Second, is the point of finance for the work here, as you know that we do not get any subsidy for this section, at the present time we gets \$3.00, a week from a local comrade here, and by time you ride the car four or five times this amount is gone and we to go places where we can't walk because it is so far out, when the Ex-Service Men was coming thru here from other States we was not able to get no leaflets to them because we did not have the money to get them out with, and then we had to run around for two or three days to get up enough money to buy paper and other material we had to have in getting the leaflets out. It is very urgent that we get at least \$5.00, a week to help us out in the work especially with our election campaign in view. The feild we have here for work now is very splendid and with some body to work with the work here can go very much better that it is at the present time. As the word is that the south is important, very much so, but send forces.
