munist Party explained yesterday, in a long statement published in The Daily Worker, recent expulsions by declaring that "Left sectarianism" as well as the "Right opportunism" of Earl Browder was challenging the basic strategy and tactical line of the party laid down at the Emergency Convention in July, 1945.

Specifically the victims of the most recent purge—William F.

recent purge-William Dunne, who once shared leadership with William Z. Foster and Mr. Browder; Ruth McKenney, author of the "My Sister Eileen" stories, and her husband, Bruce Minton, former New Masses correspondent, and Vern Smith, West Coast Communist writer—were charged with following the line of "semi-Trotskyism and unprincipled Leftist adventurism." The chief grievance in the bill of particulars against the ousted

statement, was that they had advanced the "petty-bourgeois, anarchistic slogan of freedom of criticism" to facilitate their propogation of views hostile to the party."

Sees "Duty" to Criticize

our party constitution, which is bared on the principle of democratic centralism," but declared

cratic centralism," but declared the dissidents had "distorted" that right.

The statement left no doubt that the present leadership of the party headed by Mr. Foster, which originally expelled Mr. Browder, his brother William Browder, and A. A. Heller, considered the latest batch to be purged farther to the Left than the current "line" warranted.

"Browder's revisionism," the

statement said, "would lead to vic-

tory for reaction by advocating reliance on the non-existent 'progressive' role of American monopoly capital. It would doom the party to passivity and liquidate its leading role and its very existence —a liquidation which Browder temporarily brought about. The 'Left' sectarianism would accomplish the same objective by isolating the party from the working class and the working class from all its allies. While Browderism openly surrenders our socialist objective, the 'Left' sectarians would make the victory of socialism impossible in the name of 'social-
