

STATE COMMUNISTS ELECT COMMITTEES

The Communist party announced yesterday that its state convention, ended Monday, had elected eleven national committee and sixteen state committee members.

Only a partial list of those elected was made public. A party spokesman said that full disclosure would "endanger the job security of shopworkers on the list."

The names of fifteen of the sixteen members at large of the state committee were made public. It was said that George Blake Charney, the outgoing state committee chairman, and former City Councilman Benjamin W. Davis were returned to the committee by acclamation.

Other members, chosen by secret ballot, were Simon W. Gerson, Max Weiss, Doxey Wilkerson, Jesus Colon, William L. Patterson, Abner Berry, Maurice U. Schappes, George Watt, William Weinstone, William Albertson, Max Gordon, Mrs. Lillian Gates and Charles Loman.

No announcement was made of national committee members chosen. Mr. Charney, reached by telephone, conceded there had been differences at the convention, held at the Yugoslav-American Hall, 431 West Forty-first Street. But he declined to say whether the result had constituted a victory for any party faction.
