LEFTIST MOVEMENT OPENS HARLEM DRIVE

The Progressive Labor Movement, which has been urging the recognition of the Chinese Communists by the United States, has opened a campaign in Harlem.

The group, headed by Fred Jerome, has opened an office at 66 West 109th Street. It also has established a weekly newspaper with the name Challenge on the front and Desafio (challenge in Spanish) on the back. The paper's two last pages are in Spanish and the first six in English. Mr. Jerome is editor of the paper.

The publication indicates the line the campaign is expected to take. On the front page the paper charges "Police War on Harlem" in two-inch red headlines. The cover picture illustrates a case of alleged police brutality against a Negro. On the back page a five-column headline in Spanish says, "Police attack another Puerto Rican."
