## Chilean Revolutionary Communist Party Founded

THE Revolutionary Communist Party of Chile was founded last May at the First Marxist-Leninist Congress of Chilean Communists.

The Congress was organized by the revolutionary organization "Espartaco," the "Communist Rebel Union," a number of Communists who had split with the revisionist leadership of the Chilean Communist Party, and other revolutionary people. About 80 delegates attended the Congress.

A communique issued by the Congress said that before the Congress many regional congresses and

branch Party meetings were held at which draft documents for the Congress were discussed. The drafts of the Party statutes and Party programme, and the reports on the Party's domestic and foreign policies were discussed at the Congress. The discussion showed that the delegates to the Congress were unanimous in their opinion on the principles contained in these documents.

According to the communique, the Congress elected the national leadership committee of the Chilean Revolutionary Communist Party.
