"The Bolshevik" suspends print publication

"The Bolshevik", organ of the PMLI, suspended print publication after 44 years. A painful decision that the Political Bureau of the PMLI was forced to take as a result of the difficult economic situation that is going through the Party. "The Bolshevik" will continue, however, to go out weekly in PDF format on the website of PMLI, which can be freely downloaded completely free.

In the editorial of the latest issue paper, the Directorate and the Central Editors of *"The Bolshevik"* agree to "do *'The Bolshevik'* a newspaper even stronger, competent and red, to give voice to the workers and the masses and youth, to expose and combat the ideology, culture, press and bourgeois propaganda, to be a true reflection of the strategic battle PMLI to conquer Italy united, socialist and red, as well as the daily battles against the bosses, the government, local governments, and all the joints of the power of the bourgeois ruling class. " The editorial concludes with these words: "One day, we are sure, *'The Bolshevik'* returns to shine in all its splendor paper, because we Marxist-Leninists Italians are animated by the same spirit, evoked by Mao, Yu Kung that, together with his children, his grandchildren and all the people, he managed to pave the two mountains that barred the way. "

"The Bolshevik" was founded December 15, 1969 by the first four pioneers of PMLI (Giovanni Scuderi, Mino Pasca, Patrizia Pierattini, Nerina "Lucia" Paoletti, the latter died in 2006). It was a month of only two pages. It is now a weekly sixteen pages.

The first two political directors were Giovanni Scuderi, the current Secretary General of the PMLI, and Mino Pasca. The first two directors were responsible Giovanni Scuderi and Patrizia Pierattini. The current director is responsible Monica Martenghi.

All four, together or separately, have undergone processes for crimes of opinion in reference to articles published in *"The Bolshevik"*.
