Corrade.

This is to inform the Secretariat about the work of our District in the last few weeks, and to ask for specific juidance on a number of tasks we are undertaking.

- (1) Under separate cover we have sent a five page letter outlining our criticism of the September issue of The Communist, as well as the plan we have adopted to intensify our propagated work within the District around the pager, this was sent to the propagate committee.
- (\*) Concerning the paper on Fuerto Rico We have not yet had an opportunity to discuss the Mp paper, but were Makenam wied to see the center take initiative on this matter. PSP has a full time person here in the Bay Area or genicing for the demonstration, though the work has been very isolated from what we can tell. We will write more about the MAPER paper later. However, one issue was striking about the paper, and that was that PRANO was not mentioped. Frankly we were quite surprised about this and have some questions:

-is PANNO working on this event. If so, what is their work, if not, why:

-Does the fact that they were not mentiond in the paper say anything about our discussions with them

These questions raise other issues for us, which relate to the process of how unity is built with organizations. Comrades are easer to learn more about PREWO, and feelthat the center should live some guidance on this questions. The temannist and other publications blow the line that we are real tight with PREWO, etc. and yet our own cadre are practically imberent - are ignorant, of PREWO and its line. Hany cadere have been put in difficult positions because of this, and we would appreciate some material from the Center about PREWO. Following through on this is important, so that unity can be fought for and built throughout the organization with PREWO, and not sprung on comrades. Perhaps this zi is over axam of a problem in the west than in the cast, because there is no contact with PREWO out here. Anything available both about PREWO and our relationship with them would be appreciated.

(3) On relations with ATM

As we have indicated in previous letters, we fell that our hands are sort of tied in regard to ATM out here, in the absence of more concrete leadership from the Center about our strately with ATM. On the one hand, we have a number of criticisms of ATM's line in the pamphlet, particularly in trade union work, combined with the numerous problems conducting relations with them out hore. On the other hand we do not want to rush shead raising criticism of them without some idea as to the plan for working with them, what the Conter has in mind, etc.

In line with this, we noticed that ATH will make a presentation to them Ti

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line, to propers for the TV Conference. Do you have any ideas about how see should proceed in this regard? What are nationals plans? Our action here is notiveted by the desire to build real unity with ATM, but that unity has to be based objectively, on strayele. For while on the surface it may seem that there is a very high level of unity, diffing desper that may not be the case, and the point here is to gain elerity on this. We should have a deaft of the paper by the end of the month, then we plan to revise it and will send it along as seen as possible. We would like to know if we should present it to ATM before the TV conference. Should we make copies of it for confederates at the TV conference.

- (4) As the comrede visiting there will propobly explain, we plan to see improve and publish the talk we gave on China. "Chinas Swo Line Struggle, The Chinase Struggle Against Revisionism." We are obtaining criticism of it from forces around and hope to have it published as a pauphlet around the first of the year. Now should we proceed on this score. Our investigation indicates that it will be useful in friendship work, help conrades group the central treak of party building better, and also soll well.
- (3) on security
  We are now reworking an early draft mark on security in the organization werrapared for the District, which is based on a political discussion of security, the state and fascism. We plan to print this clong with three articles from the CI; The Question of Proleterian Defense by L Alfred, On The Question of Illegal Work (1933), andRevolutionary Work Underground Bark New No/t To Prepare for Underground Conditions of Revolutionary Work by O. Weber( 1932). We thought that such a document would be a good internal document on security, and might be of use to contades around the country. As soon as a final draft to finished we will send it to you for comments, with the plan that If it is OK, it could be printed and distributed at the TU conference pessibly.
- (6) In the last weeks we have come across a great deal of very valuable material from the CI, particularly on the question of factory suclei/trade union work and faction. The cost of serox is really prohibiting, so we have tentative plans to propare two readers. We may have a printer and free we of a web press, which means we would only have to buy newsprint.

One reeder would be on trade union work, collecting about 10 art icles from the GI which mostly focus on factory nucell, together with some kind of introduction. We think that this should be ready for the TO conference.

Second, the reader on faccism would would be along the same lines, to be ready efter the first of the year some time.

In both cases, we am certain that such readers would have a tremendous impact politicalyon the communist movement, particularly now the one on TV work. In addition, they would certainly be fund ratains efforts, and would sell vary well.

We would like on IMMEDIATE HESPONSE on this, since if the TV reader is to be exemptated

completed in time for the TV conference, we have to get going.

An introduction would have to be written, and the question is whether or not we should do this, or the center. There is also the question of who would distribute it, the center or us. Frobably better if the center did.

Lastly, de you have any prospects for some busk for either of these to buy paper?

If the plan to print them with a web press feils, we will do an offset job here for the District, unless we can get some woney from other Districts who might want copies.

(7) This last point we feel very strongly about. A couple of days ago conversation with the sister from these parts who is now in Detroit.

The discussion first developed about the Atlanta erticle. When we raised what she thought about it, she replied that it was such better than when the center get it. Then we asked about why the question of self determination was not taken up, and she had not even thought about it. First, we she had heard nothing of the previous criticism we had raised, and more important, she had not even thought about this.

Then the discussion developed a little batte the point where she stated on the phone that "it will be along time before your District will be able to give any contribution to the Center."

Courade, we feel that there so number of important issues here which should be taken up right away. The most important point as far as we are concerned in that if this courade has that attitude toward us, it must also rub off toward here attitude with other cadre. The result obviously which has a would be to destroy the makeful functioning of democratic centralism, bread contempt for the Center, discourage cadre from trying to build the organization, etc. The insident with this sister raises assainant a deeper straggle really, and that is the struggle by the organization to get the codre to take up the paper as their own, not just in distributing it, but in writing it, criticisting articles... in taking real indulive to make it a paper of codre.

With both the paper and the TV conference, from where we stand our here, not enough effort has been made to rely on cadre, to encourage their participation in building the paper and the maference. We have heard no reply to any of the suggestions we have made wither about the Communist or the TV scaference. We are not in any way synical about this, and realize that there are many struggles to be waged to improve our work, many obstacles

to evercome to helehovise the BNC. It is in the spirit of everything for the party that we will continue to do all we can to build the organization - to build the party, continue to forward crit and suggestions for work.

But more needs bo be done from the Center to rely on cadre, to pay ettention to eadre, to know the cadre. What this particular indicaont with the sister represents in terms of these larger problems is the key thing here as far as we are concerned.

This kind of arrogance is poison to the organization, and were comes out in thepaper as well. It must be resolutely fought.

- (2) Another thought around Puerco Rico occured which I'll spell out. One weakness of the paper which is significant in that it does not talk about the role of the conscious element in the PASHG - that is the real reason why it is important to discuss PARNO. The danger in uniting in such ecolitions is from the right, giving up the initative to the bourgeoise. not seeing that we should enter into such alliances on the besis of unity and struggle. That means to unito with the CPUBA in the PROSC means that we must at the came time wage a struggle against all forms of opportunion, particularly that of the CPUMA. Valess that straggle is vaged in the coalition, there is no way to both waite and struggle. For that struggle to be waged we must be clearen the constious element, which means on the role of FARMO and other ML forces. While the importance of straggle against the GPUSA is raised - it must be raised concretely. interms of how this struggle will be waged, with what forces, under what Obviously this article raises a lot of important questions we will be facing and we look forward to gettles into the fray around these issues. This clearly is the content in which to take up and deepend our grasp of the united front against importation and the role of the communists in the present period - without a communist party to lead the proletariet.
- (9) A quick thought about the TV conference. Look forward to the presentation on the GPUSA, which we feel is very important. We would a loo suggest some presentation on the role of the Trots in trade union work, as they are moving into the class more and more. He the GPUSA, could the presentation take up a history of the factory nuclei in the GPUSA, under what conditions it was adapted advanced by the GI (1927...) why the GPUSA took it up and how it worked, how and why it was abolished in thelate thirties... 1937 I think...

To re-interace a few items:

please let us know about the readers on TU work and fascism what about the publication of the china talk what about the security paper...

We have raised a lot of things in the letter sed realize that there are easy atoms of work of the MS that we are not ismildr with and which obviously limits our view on questions. Soo our attitude is that if something is incorrect, off the well or out to lunch, let us hanv. But the key thing is to let us know. It is easy for us to fall book, he timid in regard to critician, and let things slide, but we do not want that to happen. Our organization grows strong in the struggle against amateurishness, which is opportunism, pure and simple. A lot of what we have said hero can be expanded on by courage b who is out here now, and we our having good to like.
