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UNION MEETING REPORT

The union meeting on 2/8/76 was really something. Tempers got real hot; especially in support of the sweepers. Fleetwood (Judy, their forman) says they ain't doing their job, so they got to start at midnight. Jim Gabbard kept talking about the language of "local demand 113" that the sweepers "will work as in the past". A Negro national min-ority workerr stated that "that language isnt clear to nobody". Gabbard agreed -- then this worker asked how could they accept all this vague language in the contract. The shop chairman stated along with Pres. Rufus Coleman that this evasive language will be changed in the '76 contract. This remains to be seen.

Then another worker requested info on his grievance, that had been in for about 15 mos. We were informed by our representatives that they are hip that people lose their homes, and possessions behind the slow grievance procedure, but that they personally spoke in favor of speeding up the grievance procedure at the production workers conf. in

Jan, at Cobo Hall. Fellow workers, the grievance procedure & was speeded up in '73. The problem with the grievance procedure is that it does not work at a'l, except for the company. The grievance procedure ties our hands. By reducing our demands for justice to writing, the union and the company prevents our getting a just settlement to our problems

where we are strong, on the shop floor.
