DUMP BUSH AND DUMP THE SYSTEM!

We are proud to join with you in this anti-imperialist war protest in Boston, cradle of the American Revolution.

The brutal and criminal Bush-led U.S. imperialist wars against the people of Afghanistan and Iraq were overwhelmingly supported by representatives of both political parties! Bush was granted full war powers by Congress with only one dissenting vote. There was massive bi-partisan support for the USA PATRIOT Act and for "Plan Colombia" with \$1.6 billions directed against the liberation movement of Colombia and the Andean Region of Latin America. With little debate and virtually no opposition, record Pentagon budgets were passed of over \$400 billion a year plus the \$87 billion "down payment" allocated for the cost of occupation and "reconstruction" of Iraq. Both political parties have been enthusiastic in providing billions of new dollars to "homeland security".

While much of the 'progressive movement' has been going "light" on the Democratic Party war-mongers and focusing on the Republican National Convention in New York City next month, it is thus vitally important that we have brought this protest to the doorstep of the Democratic National Convention.

Presidential hopeful (and a darling of the AFL-CIO top leadership) Dick Gephardt brokered the deal for war with the Bush Administration. Vice Presidential candidate, John Edwards, was one of the most vocal advocates for Bush's war while on the presidential campaign trail. Bill Clinton, idol of the Democratic Party, has provided broad support for George W. Bush. John Kerry, who will be crowned this week with the nomination for president, has virtually the same position as George W. Bush when it comes to the most important political issue facing the working people of the United States and the world — the Bush-led drive for empire and unending and preemptive wars for oil (and other) profit.

There is deafening silence in the halls of Congress, and undoubtedly from the leadership of this Convention, when it comes to ending the occupation of Iraq and Afghanistan and bringing the troops home, now! In the face of the military overextension of U.S. imperialism and the invoking of "Stop Loss" measures (keeping soldiers in active duty and/or in combat longer than their enlistment) Democratic Party leaders are instead calling for a larger military.

The two political parties serve the same master: U.S. monopoly capitalism. In 1960, Kennedy was the liberal peace candidate, Nixon the conservative war candidate. Kennedy won. We got the Bay of Pigs invasion against the new revolutionary Cuba and the initial U.S. troop build-up in Vietnam. In 1964 Goldwater was the "hawk", Johnson the "dove". Johnson won. We got "Goldwater's" Vietnam. The needs of U.S. imperialism for super-profits supercede the positions of any candidate of either the Democratic or Republican branch of the WAR PARTY.

There have been fissures within the ruling class leading up to and since the invasion and occupation of Iraq. Within the Republican Party, and even within the Bush family, there were

those who promoted a multilateral approach with UN participation. In addition, sections of the Democratic Party were a major force behind the formation of the pro-imperialist "Win Without War" coalition promoting "diplomacy" in Iraq while embracing the same goals of toppling the Hussein government and controlling the vast oil resources of Iraq. However, there is overwhelming unity among those in both parties of the duopoly on the objective of imperialist plunder and full support for the so-called "War on Terrorism".

Lenin proved that "Imperialism means war". The U.S. imperialist terrorist war on the workers and oppressed peoples of the world is not a deviation of the system or the outcome of a mad "lone ranger" in the White House. It is the inevitable outcome of the imperialist economic system and its drive to maximize profit at home and abroad. US imperialism seeks to re-divide the world for the enrichment of US finance capital at the expense of its imperialist rivals and especially at the expense of working people all over the world.

George W. Bush the <u>selected</u> U.S. President is a particularly brutal, arrogant, dishonest, chauvinistic and corrupt representative of U.S. imperialism, the leading imperialist power, the lone "super-power", the number one terrorist. If Bush is driven from office due to opposition to his war program and drive toward fascism it will represent a positive mass sentiment among the working class and oppressed nationalities. But let there be no illusions. Dumping Bush does not "dump" imperialist war. Nor does it represent "regime change" from the Enron, Halliburton, Bechtel, Lockheed and Boeing and the corporate dominance of finance capital over our lives.

The Clinton campaign coined the phrase: "It's the economy, stupid". Our answer to the Democrats/Republicans and their apologists: "It's the system." By building revolutionary organization; by linking ourselves with the international working class and the national liberation movements, first and foremost the just and growing national liberation movement of Iraq; by building a powerful mass anti-imperialist war movement united with a strong anti-globalization movement; by defending immigrant, women's and trade union rights and other democratic rights; no matter who sits in the White House; we can win real regime change, a new American Revolution.

Peace serves the masses of humanity. The only path to world peace is through the defeat of imperialism, headed by U.S. imperialism, leading to the elimination of the system of exploitation of man by man and the establishment of Socialism.
