The unanimous election and acclamation of the Central Committee of the Communist Party of Portuguese Workers marked, yesterday, the closing of the work, behind closed doors, of the MRPP National Congress, which would be followed by the public Closing Session.

It was a moment of indescribable enthusiasm, great vibration and revolutionary impetus, in the spirit of an iron unity of the congressional comrades, of great determination, firmness and confidence in the future and destinies of the Revolution.

The applause still grew when, knowing the results of the election, Comrade Arnaldo Matos addressed the podium and from there took the floor for a brief

## THE 'PARTY PRESS THESES': RUN THE NEWSPAPER, BUILD THE PARTY

The discussion of the "Theses on the Party Press" began at the third working day of the second day of Congress and marked the closing of that evening.

After Comrade Arnaldo Matos's presentation of the theses, prolonged, loud applause from vibrant slogans erupted in the Congress hall. It was a significant manifestation of support for the Theses, even before their discussion and approval by Congress.

Yesterday morning, when the work resumed, close to a hundred delegates had already signed up to take the floor, and no doubt that a lively and lively discussion encouraging all comrades - even with differing positions - to take the floor, was the that followed.

Comrades made proposals on how to carry out the Theses, the elaborate plans, particularly as regards the 'economic' battle to save and maintain the Party newspaper, the daily 'popular struggle', as well as its central theoretical journal.

The questions were clear, surely some voices did not speak out hoping for a better time. It is a tough class battle that awaits us.
