AIMS of the Marxist-Leninist Organisation of Britain

The Marxist-Leninist Organisation of Britain holds that the historic destiny of the British working people, led by the working class, is :

To end the capitalist system of society, based on the exploitation of man by man, by means of the revolutionary overthrow of the ruling class of monopoly capitalists and the smashing of the capitalist state, the apparatus of force by which they rule;



To establish the rule of the working people, led by the working class, by setting up a new state, the democratic dictatorship of the proletariat;

To build a socialist society based on common ownership of the means of production, with economic life planned in the interests of the masses of the people – a society which will develop material; abundance and create a new socialist man and so proceed to the construction of a communist society based on the principle "to each according to his needs".

Without a Marxist-Leninist Party as its vanguard, the working class cannot fulfil this historic destiny. The betrayal of every fundamental principle of Marxism-Leninism and of revolutionary class struggle by the leadership of the Communist party of Great Britain has transformed it into a "left" appendage of the Labour Party which objectively serves the interests of the British monopoly capitalists. This degeneration has left the British working class without such a Marxist-Leninist party.

The primary aims of the Marxist-Leninist Organisation of Britain are, therefore, to build as speedily as possible a Marxist-Leninist party of the working class in our country, and to elaborate a programme for the achievement of socialism in Britain.
