A proper study of the above should lead to the discussion of some of the following: - economic independence-self reliancedictatorship of proletariat-nationalisation of industry-priority to which sections of the national economy-proper ratio between the production of the means of production and the manufacture of consumer goods-relationship between heavy industry, light industry and agriculture-raw materials-socialist accumulation- proper balance between accumulation and consumption-why socialism can do without without taxation-etc, etc.

2) While pursuing this section of study, we should continually keep in mind what a socialist Britain has to learn from all this varied experience, as well as the areas where we have different problems and would need different solutions. This section of study should make the Party consider what we would need within a socialist economy - encourage to study what exists in the different economic brenches of capitalist Britain (or waht is missing or declining). Has our study helped to make more real our slogan of 'Save Britain'?
