I don't want this to prepare some polemic or something like that but I want to have this all in the back of my mind as we prepare documents and reports for the World Congress and as I think about discussions with other comrades.

Please send me back my draft of the eurocommunism document that I did some editing on in ink. M-A told me over the phone that you didn't get it until after the Secretariat so I guess it didn't do any good. Some of the notes I want to have for my own use. You can keep a xerox or you can ask me to send you back a xerox.

M-A gave me a brief report over the phone about the Secretariat meeting and the successes with the women's document. It's almost like a historic breakthrough. She also mentioned the British convention and I thought she said that Jim was there. If Jim was there and he does one of his cassette tape reports back to John or someone, I'd very much like a copy.

In light of everything that's happening in Britain our tentative thinking here is to reject the proposal from John Ross that we co-edit <u>International</u>. As you can tell from his letter it's a different proposal than we came to agreement with that night that Joe, Caroline and I spoke to him at Connie's. Anyway, we can be very diplomatic, very congratulatory on their plans, agree to circulate it here, but I think to get tied up with them and co-responsible given the current developments in Britain (e.g. concern over "Sheppard's take-over of the center") and the problems with IP circulation, etc., may be just asking for trouble. We can always change our minds in six months, a year, year-and-a-half. Let us know right away whether you agree or have a different view on this. We will await your opinion before we
