Comrades were agreeable to that, but thought we should aim to adopt a new version of the document at the March U Sec, rather than putting it off to May, because we would need time to publish the new version in the bulletin and have comrades be able to discuss it.

Charles-André said he had reread it over Christmas and thinks it will be difficult to simply amend it or insert new sections--that it needs substantial rewriting and a lot of work. In addition to the civil war being left out, the political revolution is also left out.

While agreeing to postpone the U Sec discussion, comrades thought we needed to begin discussing and writing on this.
