Dear Comrades,

As plans proceed toward April 15 many locals have reported that numbers of new people are becoming involved in activities, giving us new opportunities to disseminate our ideas, especially through our literature.

War and Revolution in Vietnam contains our basic analysis of the war and the fight against it, and has been used by us on a campaign basis to spread our ideas to the antiwar movement. Looking over our records it is clear that the pamphlet sells in cycles. That is, we seem to sell it to a layer of individuals, eventually exhausting that layer. Sales then fall off until another action occurs drawing in another layer, when sales again pick up.

It is important, given the new numbers of youth becoming involved, to make special efforts now to sell this pamphlet on a campaign basis.

With the approach of the convention and the short time between the convention and April 15, it will be difficult for the National Office to service orders quickly. Therefore, we urge all locals to survey their stock of this pamphlet, anticipate what their needs will be, and order immediately so that we can bring your order with us to the convention, where you can pick it up.

This same procedure applies to our other pamphlets as well.
