Dear Campaign Directors and YSHB Organizers:

The supporters of Eugene McCarthy have called for simultaneous rallies on Thursday, August 15 in many cities all over the country. They are calling August 15th "M-Day" and are publicizing these rallies widely. Senator McCarthy will be speaking at Madison Square Garden at 8:15 p.m. on the evening of August 15th and his speech will be carried to the other rallies by closed circuit television.

In a full page ad in the <u>New York Times</u> (August 4, 1968) it was reported that 153 movie stars, singers, actors, musical groups, etc. will be featured at these rallies.

The cities where these rallies are scheduled to be held are: Albuquerque, New Mexico; Atlanta, Ga.; Austin, Texas; Boston, Mass.; Cedar Rapids, Iowa; Charlotte, North Carolina; Chicago, Ill.; Cleveland, Ohio; Detroit, Mich.; Hartford, Conn.; Houston, Texas; Indianapolis, Ind.; Kansas City, Mo.; Lansing, Mich.; Los Angeles, Calif.; Madison, Wis.; Miami, Fla.; Milwaukee, Wis.; Minneapolis, Minn.; New York, N.Y.; Philadelphia, Pa.; Phoenix, Ariz.; Pittsburgh, Pa.; Portland, Ore.; Providence, R.I.; St. Louis, Mo.; Salt Lake City, Utah; San Francisco, Calif.; Seattle, Wash.

These rallies will gather together tens of thousands of McCarthy sympathizers and will be an excellent opportunity to sell "The Truth About the McCarthy Campaign" and distribute campaign literature. At a similar rally in New York in June the New York campaign committee sold over 400 copies of the McCarthy pamphlet. On August 15th we should be able to sell over 1,500 of the pamphlets on a national scale. All local areas are urged to send in reports on how many are sold in their area so that we can publish a national report.

If areas need more McCarthy pumphlets, order them immediately in order to receive them in time for the rallies.

Since we sent out the first proposed tour schedule for Fred Halstead and Paul Boutelle's fall tours, we have received several important suggestions for changing the schedules. The enclosed schedules attempt to incorporate these changes. We realize that these revised schedules may still not be totally satisfactory, and if necessary minor adjustments will be made.

The first important change in Boutelle's schedule is to begin his tour in Seattle so that he will be able to be at the convention of 100 people that is required to get the SWP on the ballot in the state of Washington. Once he is on the West Coast it is more economical and practical to do the West Coast before heading East. However, it is important that Halstead also speak in California before the elections, and we have scheduled him to be in the Bay Area at the same time as Boutelle for the Bay Area conference.

The combined membership of the Bay Area locals is larger than any other in the country. This factor along with the rapidly growing opportunities were considered as serious reasons for scheduling both candidates in the same area.

Halstead has been scheduled for New York on November 2 because of the national importance of a large rally in New York just before the elections.

Denver has been added to the schedule.

We have raised the tour quotas slightly from the spring tour quotas because we found that the quotas didn't cover the expenses of the candidates' tours. It is expected that fund raising receptions and collections at big meetings in the fall will bring in more money for the campaign than in the spring.

If there are any suggested changes in the schedules or the quotas please let us know right away.
