Special mention was made of the protests held in Los Angeles and Minneapolis against troops in Lebanon. It was also reported that the new IBM club in Detroit -- Independent Socialist Youth- was organizing a full program of activites for the near future, Around 20-50 people have been coming to meetings of the ISY or the Wayne Socialist Club which is still in existence.

3. Tour Report: Baltimore has so far sent in the best news on the prospective tour. Comrade Kaufman reported plans for getting Tim on to the Goucher. Morgan, Hopkins and a provate High School campuses. Ellie reported the possibility of getting on the U. of Maryland campus. Philly feels it can get Tim on the Temple, Penn, Swarthmore and Drexel campuses. Vancouver promises a date at the University of British Columbia campus. - 5. Conference: A premininary discussion was held on conference agenda and other arrangements. It was tentitively agreed to make no changes in the proposed agenda (see minutes—June 17, 1958) except that the Theoretical discussion should probably be held on the War Question. Two points which were not spelled out in detail in the "Memo"— method of representation at the conference and proposed organizational form— were briefly discussed but no decision was taken in order to afford more time to hear from other careas on their ideas. It was decided to hold a preliminary discussion on the War Question at the next meeting dealing with usch points as : conscription, summit, H-Tests, a socialist position for a future war, etc.
- 6. Supporter Card System: Motion: W have a sustaining system in order to organize financial support for the YS among our supporters. We issue cards to YS supporters on the basis of a minimum sustaining pledge of \$.50 a month.

 EXEX After a discussion of possible symbols for such a card which covered everything from hammer and sickle, through arm andhammer, to Sherman-Williams Paint sign— it was decided that the red flag will be our symbol. The following motto(lifted bodily from the old YPSL) was proposed for the back of our cards: March together, work together, strike together with us, thgether we can build a warless world, a workers world. All above motions and proposals agreed on unan.
- 7. East Coast Conference and Camp: It was decided tohave a weekend encampment at Mountain Spring Camp sometime after Labor Day to invokve YS supporters on the East Coast (largely NYC, Philly, Baltimore). In addition the board felt that any East Coast Conference planned xxxxxxxxx on the initiative of Philly would be all to the good and not necessarily conflict with the camp idea. A xxxx aname speaker such as Otto Nathan will be sought for the encampment.
- 8. Area reports: RBelgium— We have recived warm congratulations from the editorial board of "La Gauche" for our work in putting out the YS. Texas—We will be sending a regualr bundle to a supporter at the Ul of Houston from now on. Baltimore—10 people from Philly went to Baltimore for a weekend. A meeting wasehld attended by 30 persons. A. Phelps and A. Robert Kaufman spoke. Philly— Philly Young Socialist Club is now operating on a high level following an organizational re-organization.
