

### **RECORD PROFITS**

The fabulous wealth of the most successful film actors and musicians is legendary. Recently, Richard Harris, the actor, sold his Kensington home for a profit of nearly £300,000, according to the Daily Mail (3/4/74). It was sold for over £350,000 to Jimmy Page, guitarist of the Led Zepplin group, who outbid David Bowie for the property. Richard Harris has now gone on to buy a £200,000 beachside house in the Bahamas (incidentally also a "tax haven"

### NIXON MAKES ANOTHER 'MISTAKE'

"Thus far of Mr Nixon's intimate former staff, his counsel and personal lawyer are self-confessed felons, his appointments secretary now a convict. His former deputy assistant for domestic affairs, Mr Egil Krogh, is also a confessed felon but so far is the only White House man to have actually begun his jail sentence (Times 4/4/74).

It is to this level that the Government of the most powerful capitalist nation in the world had sunk, until the even further revelations of Nixon's tax affairs. Almost without pausing for breath he has taken responsibility for paying back over half a million dollars in taxes which had illegitimately been deducted from his tax returns. All terrible "mistakes" of course, and, mistakes of his staff, his advisers, or anyone but himself.

One of the more notable "mistakes" was the deduction of \$5.391 to pay for Tricia Nixon's masked ball, deducted as a business expense.

"Of course any of us can make mistakes in working out , tax returns. But the illegitimate deduction of \$576,000 on one transaction can hardly be passed off as a "mistake", especially by the man who more than any other American had a political and moral responsibility to see that his personal affairs ere above easpicion, and who moreover was a tax lawyer by profession". (Times 5/4/74)

Every investigation conducted, every fact uncovered, only releases the further stench of corruption and graft from the ruling circles. So rotten has American capitalism become that cracks in its facade are opening at every level right up to the top. Every new revelation adds ammunition to those fighting to overthrow not only the Nixon Government, but the whole capitalist system.

### CAPITALISM NO ANSWER

Professor Galbraith told a recent conference that unless cities were run as "Socialist enterprises", then they faced disastrous problems. He said: "Capitalism has never in any country been efficient for building houses which, it seems necessary to stress, are a rather important urban artefact ... nor does it provide good health services ... "

Until recently Professor Galbraith was one of those economists whose views were the lifeblood of all those in the Labour Movement who declared that Marxism was outmoded. His supporters in Britain argued that because capitalism had changed its nature, the modern "industrial state" could intervene to deal with social problems, making socialism outmoded ...

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One of the highlights of this year's LPYS Conference and Rally will be the first public meeting of the campaign organised by Hammersmith North LPYS branch on the question of Ireland. This campaign could not be launched at a better time, with the election of a Labour Government, giving the whole movement in Britain the opportunity to look closely at its policies in relation to Ireland.

The continuing toll of sectarian murder and army repression clearly illustrate the dangers faced by workers in the North of Ireland, and pose fundamental issues for the British workers.

The Tory Government, whilst hypocritically preaching "moderation" in reality continued and strengthened the policies of repression. To further this they introduced such measures as the Emergency Provisions Act which allows detention and search. purely on the basis of "suspicion". Under these measures of internment, the police and army have the right to round up and lock away for a number of years any opponent on the "evidence" of suspicion on the part of police or army officers. No proof of having done anything is required!

It is not all that widely realised among the workers in Britain, the extent that the basic democratic rights, fought for bitterly here, have been revoked in Northern Ireland.

Would the Labour Movement stand idly by while such measures were introduced to shackle and muffle the workers here? The answer to that question is in the resistance to the Tories' Industrial Relations Act which attempted to limit the rights of the trade unions.

Unfortunately, both the repressive legislation, and the bogus peace moves were supported by the Labour Party Parliamentary leadership under what has been called the "Bipartisan" approach.

The Hammersmith North campaign demands a different approach. Labour must base its policies on the needs of the workers, not, as with the recent Sunningdale agreement, on the needs of the different shades of Tories both here and in Ireland.

The Sunningdale agreement moved not one inch nearer a solution on any one of the fundamental problems which face the workers: high unemployment; chronic housing; poverty. Yet the roots of sectarianism lie in just these conditions. Only a Socialist policy for sweeping them away can finally deal with the horror of sectarian bitterness and violence.

The leaders of the Assembly, as was patently the strategy of Whitelaw, are only searching for a "solution" in the sense of developing what they would regard as more "normal" conditions in which capitalists would

be prepared to invest. They have not one shred of a solution for workers of either religion.

A class lead would find a response at a time when inflation is eating into the standards of all workers. Historical precedent shows that class unity in Ireland is not a myth. Within recent memory, strikes by postal workers have been solid, with sectarian barriers completely broken down. Frequently the level of militancy has been higher than in Britain - the hospital workers in Northern Ireland voted 92% for strike action last year. If at such a local level a clear class policy could win both Catholic and Protestant votes, how much greater would a concerted campaign from the Labour Movement have been?

The British Labour Movement must see that the repression in Ireland affects them. The army is using the situation as a training ground for future battles in Britain: it is preparation for struggles against the Labour Movement. Already CS gas is stockpiled in Britain; the Territorial Reserves are training for potential civil war situations.

The role played by the Provisional has clouded the role of the British Army in the eyes of millions of British workers. The mistaken policies of terror - bombings and shootings - have only succeeded in making the sectarian division

### **COMMITTEE RESOLUTION ON-**



It is appropriate that the LPYS Conference this year has on its agenda an extended resolution on Latin America. This is important, (National Committee LPYS) not only because of the dramatic events that have taken place there since the last National Conference but above all because these events have an immediate bearing on the future faced by the British and world Labour Movement.

> War between the classes has raged unabated throughout Latin America over the last year, Militant has published one article after another describing the repression of trade unionists in Peru, the massacre of Bolivian farm workers, the ghastly deeds of the torturers, executioners and assassination squads in Brazil. Faced with the desperate resistance of starving workers and peasants, the owners of the wealth in Latin America — bankers, industrialists, landlords, shareholders waxing fat in the stock markets of Wall Street, the City of London, the Bourse and the other financial palaces of world capitalism — have systematically handed over state power to the military protection gangs.

Unrelieved horror is capitalism means to the working people of Latin America today.

Towering above every other event have been the seizure of power by the military dictatorship in Chile on the one hand, and the final collapse of the old military regime in Argentina... The triumph of the Generals in Bolivia in 1971, in Uruguay last July, and - at a cost of 50,000 murdered workers last September, completed the armed encirclement of Argentina as it trembled on the brink of a whole era of revolutionary upheavals. Apart from revolutionary Argentina, the entire Latin American continent is one vast prison camp.

But, however bloodthirsty the ambitions of the dictators of Brazil, Chile and other countries, and however hard they try to trample on every last vestige of the workers' rights, they cannot stamp out the proud traditions of the trade union movement, or the workers' undimmed aspirations for Socialism.

The heroic resistance of the Bolivian, Uruguayan and Chilean workers testifies to this, as does the overthrow of the Argentine dictatorship in a huge elemental wave of general strikes and insurrections, which shook every government in the continent and gave hope to every worker.

# CONFIDENCE

All supporters of the Militant will welcome this conference and Rally at Clacton this Easter. There is every sign that it will have a record attendance, over 1500: a wonderful display of the active youth in the Labour Movement.

As the first conference in the Movement in the 6 weeks since Labour was elected, we are sure that it will live up to its record of clearly arguing for a bold Socialist Programme to sweep away the Tory system.

This conference will be a real tribute to the work of the LPYS over the past few weeks in mobilising support; but more than anything it will be a tribute to the patient work of the youth over the past few years.

### **GENERAL ELECTION**

Since the Skegness rally a year ago, enormous strides have been taken. The LPYS has shown itself to be up to the tasks in

The intervention in the General Election, reported in Militant, was a clear sign of the fighting strength and even more so of the potential. The work done in that election probably resulted in a doubling of the LPYS membership.

There can be no doubt that the LPYS is on the verge of a real breakthrough towards its goal of a mass socialist youth movement. The response to this rally is but one sign of this!

When the Militant was begun, nearly 10 years ago, the situation in the (then) Young Socialists was in marked contrast. Beset by sectarianism and bureaucratic he avy - handedness, oppórtunities were lost.

### FIGHT FOR SOCIALISM

Our firm perspective of fighting to build the youth movement, to win over the rank and file to Marxist ideas, was scorned as many so-called Utopian, by "'Marxists''.

The way in which the LPYS has grown and has increasingly shown its ability to give a lead to the whole Labour Movement in the struggle for Socialism is a testament to the correctness of

that outlook.

The months and years following this rally will be ones of storm and stress. Great working class battles are on the order of the day.

Labour Party Young The Socialists, armed with the programme of Marxism, can go forward in the lead of the struggle to put the whole movement on the standpoint of a fighting Socialist programme. It is that which can fill every Socialist, young and old, with confidence for the future.

### INTERNATIONAL UNION OF SOCIALIST YOUTH

Any Socialist organisation worthy 250,000 workers of the name holds high the banner of internationalism. As Karl Marx put it, "the working man has no country!" We declare that the whole world is the theatre of operations in the worldwide struggle for a new and higher stage of human civilisation -Socialism.

We start from the position that internationalism is a matter of necessity for the Labour and Trade Union movements of all countries. Capitalism, in its period of rule over the world, has developed the productive forces available to mankind and pushed the world market into all corners of the globe. The world economy is thus, more and more, an interconnected and interdependent whole. This means that the fate of the working class struggle in one country is inextricably bound up with economic and the world political fate economy and the world working class as a whole.

This fact has emerged ever more clearly in the crisis situation which the capitalist world now faces. The post war boom, one of the longest in the history of capitalism, has ended and has given way, on a world scale, to a more "normal" period of capitalist development - a period of economic disruption and dislocation against a general background of recession and downturn, ie a period of enormous social storms and stress.

### "AFFLUENT SOCIETY"

In countries such as Britain Italy, this has been abundantly clear for some time. No more do we hear from Labour leaders the plaintive cries about the "affluent society" and the "apathetic working class" in these countries! But the disease of inflation now combines with the tendency for the rate of profit to decline and the classic problem of overproduction to spell disaster even to the "miracle" economies of West Germany Scandinavia and Japan.

The dwindling of the boom and the onset of economic crisis in all capitalist countries opens up the prospect of huge class battles in which international solidarity and support will increasingly be posed as a real and burning need.

It is in this context that the International Union of Socialist Youth (IUSY) assumes significance for all readers of the Militant and for members of the LPYS.

We have already seen the effect which the unfolding crisis has had on the traditional organisations of the working class in Britain. The attacks of the last Tory Government brought forth a huge response on the part of

But equally, in Germany it is the SPD; in Sweden it is the SAP, in France and Italy the workers in the mass CPs can be reached by Young Socialists who know how to fight for the ideas of genuine Marxism who know how to repudiate the errors of ultra-leftism and sectarianism as well as the errors of piecemeal reformism

and Stalinism. We would say that the international activities of the European sections of IUSY, indeed of all IUSY sections, should be geared also to providing material assistance for those sections that are struggling in particularly difficult or critical circumstances. An example of this are the comrades in Spain, working in conditions of illegality, and the comrades in the North of Ireland who, with very small forces, are carrying out an implacable struggle against the stream of sectarian division for working class unity around a Socialist programme.

We believe that the experience of Span ish Young Socialists' Defence Campaign in Britain should be taken up throughout the IUSY in a serious and systematic way to assist our Spanish comrades. But a commitment to this kind of work and a commitment to real internationalism in practice can only come from a Marxist understanding of perspectives and the stage through which the international class struggle is proceeding at the present time.

### MMON MARKET-RIO

As the Labour Party Young Socialists debate the Common Market in Clacton, at their annual conference, in Brussels the Labour Government will be beginning their "renegotiation" of Britain's terms of entry into the EEC.

It could not be more important for the youth of the Labour Party to understand what the EEC really is and what attitude should be taken to the 'renegotiation" talks, the results of which are to be put before the electorate for approval or rejection.

The document "Common Market - No, Socialist United States of Europe - Yes" provides the basic facts about the EEC and analyses all the arguments used both by supporters and opponents of Britain's entry, concluding that both miss the most fundamental points about the class nature of this institution and both fail to relate it to the struggle for socialist policies in both Britain and Europe.

First of all, the document explains the relationship of the Common Market to developments in the world economy - "The EEC is a demonstration that the productive forces - science, technology and the organisation of labour - have outgrown private ownership and the nation state."

'Today's giant monopolies plan for markets not of 55 million as in Britain, but the 250 million of the EEC, and even the world. ICI, for instance, could supply the world with chemicals".

It was to compete with the two giant super-powers of America and Russia, plus the new power of Japanese imperialism that the capitalist nations of Western Europe formed a customs union ... "It was to have a single external tariff, and abolish all internal ones; laws governing economic policy, trade and industry, prices and taxation, were to be unified".

rocks of economic reality of the EEC countries, which in five years had lagged behind. any case reflected the world-wide economic boom of the fifties and early sixties, has been replaced by a series of crises. The capitalists of each nation have always reacted by looking after their own interests first - "none of the separate national capitalist classes can surrender any of the sovereignty of their own national state - its army, police and civil service.

They need these as a defence in the event of competition in trade leading to open political and military conflict.

But British Big Business had no alternative, as their trade became more and more with Europe rather than the Commonwealth and the rest of the world, as it had at the end of the war, The biggest monopolies, and especially the banks, saw rich pickings for them in the enlarged market. Property speculators in particular have seized the chance to make themselves even richer, by buying up huge chunks of Paris and Brussels.

But for manufacturing industry, the EEC provides no solution to the "When it becomes necessary, long term problems of the British

stand for the national interests of their own ruling class, in its manoeuvrings for a bigger share of the markets of the capitalist world; their "internationalism" is miles from the struggle of the workers of the world for a united fight against their bosses.

Thompson and Co, however, could make use of the fact that most opponents of entry within the Labour Party used the worst kind of nationalism to justify their argument. Although reflecting the deep distrust of the Common Market felt by ordinary workers, instead of portraying the EEC in class terms, they resorted to "the arguments of yesterday's Tories ... They appeal to British 'patriotism', the 'sovereignty of Parliament', the 'British way of life' and the commonwealth".

In the main, the leaders of the party did no more than oppose the "terms". They failed to see, as the document reveals, that "the terms negotiated by the Tory Government were the best that British capitalists could get from the point of view of their interests. No Labour Government is going to squeeze any more from the bosses of the continent".

As a capitalist trading group, it can never agree to policies by its members which challenge the right of the big capitalist firms to own and profit from industrial wealth. There is an irreconcilable conflict of interests between the rulers of the EEC and not just British workers, but the working class of Europe as a

The answer to the problems facing British workers lies not in the "renegotiation of the terms", not for that matter in pulling out of the EEC — "The only alternative is a Socialist one". The document concludes that only by the working class parties in all the West European countries carrying out Socialist policies of nationalisation under workers' control and management. can the workers of Europe be united and the economy be integrated and planned for the benefit of the whole population.

Already after only a year of British membership, the optimism of those who advocated entry has turned sour. The document is fully vindicated in its criticism of the Labour MPs whose votes kept the Tory Government in power. Their lofty phrases about the benefits of Common Market membership have to be tested against the grim reality rising prices and increasing conflict between the member states.

George Thompson, now an EEC Commissioner claimed that "the advocates of entry stand squarely within the socialist tradition of unity and a Socialist United States internationalism". In fact, they of Europe!"

This year's LPYS Conference seems set to repeat with a bonus the huge success that the Conference was last year.

The success of the conference last year was not just in numbers but in the quality of debate, the clear analysis of the major problems facing the working class movement here and abroad which laid the basis for a fighting programme capable of appealing to all sections of working class youth.

We think that a large number of delegates will agree that this was in no small way due to the fact that they read the Militant regularly. Even those who do not agree with all our ideas still read it as indispensable source authorative facts and analysis written by workers actively participating in the struggle for Socialism.

Without possessing a crystal ball, we were able to warn that unless the Labour leaders fought on a programme aimed at mobilising every section of the working class around a Manifesto for a Socialist transformation society, the election result would be very close. Unfortunately we were right. The return of a Labour Government was a step forward but the Labour leadership is still intent on softening the blows of capitalism without tackling the real cause of this crisis ridden system: the private ownership of the means of production.

There will be a Militant meeting at the Conference and we urge all our readers to attend. Not only that, they should make sure that anyone they know should attend as well. Here is an excellent opportunity to put your point of view if you agree with our ideas or not, as well as hearing other Young Socialists explaining and putting forward the ideas of Militant.

America aside as a remote, alien universe, where barricades, guerrillas and firing squads are commonplace features of the landscape. True, there have been 138 Bolivian Presidents in 150 years, and 12 Argentinian Presidents in 20 years. But this is no music-hall joke about tinpot colonels in Runitanian banana republics.

The explosive nature of Latin American politics is the result of the utter deadlock in the unending struggle between the classes. Abundant in mineral riches, the economy of the continent has been stunted, crippled and bled white by imperialism.

The teeming peasantry scratch a bare existence out of the soil, mute beasts of burden whose only hope of tasting the fruits of civilisation lies in a socialist reorganisation of society. The workers face vicious wage cuts. Capitalism cannot afford the luxury of trade unions and a

democratic parliamentary facade. The working class in every

grasping the levers of queues and in the sweatshops. industrial power, has the collective strength and cohesion to lead the masses in nationalising the economy and usher in a classless society in which production would be rationally harmoniously planned accordance with the needs of the people.

There is only one reason why all Latin America is not ruled by the working class, in a federation of workers' democracies: because of the policies of the workers' leaders. If only the courage of the Latin American workers were matched by the leaders of their parties, capitalism and landlordism would have been abolished decades ago. But instead mobilising the working population of town and country on a socialist programme, arming the workers and forming revolutionary committees within the armed forces to disarm the ultra-reactionally officer caste, they preferred to play politics with the representatives of the capitalists.

In Brazil, in Bolivia, in Uruguay, in Chile, again and again, these cowardly equivocations have had a rapid and deadly end — a catastrophe, not for the leaders who in most cases graciously obliged the triumphant dictators by going into

these opportunist policies of a stratum of radical intellectuals who have adopted the futile and romantic tactics of guerrilla struggle, has provided no alternative to those activists and militants in the Labour Movement who are thirsting for a bold and clear revolutionary programme.

On the contrary, by treating the socialist revolution as fundamentally a military rather than a political event, and naively assuming that once they had formed "revolutionary combat detatchments" to shoot it out with the army and police, victory was assured, they played right into the hands of the capitalists.

Party Labour Young Socialists' Conference meets this year at Clacton seven weeks after a general election in which there was a huge anti-Tory vote from the organised working class.

Young Socialists everywhere, manning the polling booths and knocking up on election day, have reported a massive turnout in the solid working class areas.

But the Labour Party failed to gain a clear majority in Parliament and the Liberal Party ("the other party of private enterprise" - Cyril Smith) gained 6 million votes. Today the Labour Party, in Government, is posed immediately with the problem of what to do now.

"Labour to Power on a Socialist Programme" (written last November but still vitally relevant) is presented to the LPYS Conference by the National Committee as a Socialist Programme for action.

The 1974 election, as we have pointed out in the pages of this paper, took place when there was an entirely different mood in the Labour Party and Trade Unions from that of 1970. There has been a radicalisation and move to the left of the rank and file worker and party activist. Militant no 176, reported that at the 1973 Labour Party Conference there was a massive number of resolulutions and amendments calling for nationalisation of the 250 monopolies under democratic workers' control and management. 

### POST OFFICE

### NALGO WORKERS FIGHT PHASE3

The following interview was given to Bill Webster (Militant Editorial Board) on 8 April by Bro John Hall, Chairman of Wandsworth NALGO and also Staff Side Secretary of the Joint Staff Committee, and Bro Mick Lyne (GMWU) Secretary of Wandsworth Council manual workers Joint Shop Stewards Committee (JSSC).

John Hall started by saying:

'The claim is for an increase in London Weighting Allowance to £400. It was presented to the Employers on the National Joint Council in June 1973. The claim is based upon the fact that the present allowance of £144.00 pa for those workers in the Inner Zone (ie 8 London boroughs) and £105.00 pa for those in the Outer Zone (ie 24 London boroughs) is totally inadequate. The claim takes into account the high cost of housing, mortgage repayments and other costs which Local Government staffs are faced with.

"One example of this is that in the NALGO document The London Weighting Claim' it points out that in order to equalise the expenditure on items such as housing and transport between the regions in the country which is based on the Family Expenditure Survey 1971 (Table 54) to Local Government white collar workers in the Greater London area must receive an increase in earnings of £395 pa!

• What was the mood of the NALGO members towards the refusal of the employers to meet the

Because of the pressure exerted by the members for action the EC decided that selective strike action would take place in seven London boroughs from 25th February. The EC also instructed all NALGO members to ban overtime in all departments services to be (emergency manned) and to refuse to work with,

agency labour (scabs) brought in by local authorities in an attempt to break the strike.

.What was the result of this action?

The leaders of the London boroughs, under the pressure of the white collar workers made a recommendation to the Greater London Whitlay Council that they were prepared to meet the claim in full over 2 years, ie £250 now and £75 in 1975 and £75 in 1976.

(At a meeting in Camden after action by the computer staffs the Labour leader of the Council stated that Camden would only pay if Foot agreed to give the go-ahead. He also stated that if the action continued the Local Government White Collar workers would lose the support of the Labour Group! - BW).

Following this move and faced with the possibility of a virtual shutdown of the Local Authority Services in London, the General Committee of the GLWC staff and employers alike, agreed an interim increase of £226 pa for Inner London and £186 pa for Outer London backdated to to November 1973. This to be without prejudice to the outcome of the Pay Board Inquiry.

•Did the Union then call off the action?

No. They decided not to escalate the strike until after the outcome of the meeting with Michael Foot on April 1st. Action that had already been taken con inued in

Now that Labour is in power, did your members feel that Mr Foot would endorse the agreement made on 19 March?

Yes. We felt that the Labour Government would be sympathetic to our claim.

What was their attitude when Mr Foot stated that the Interim Settlement (costing £1.2 million) could not be paid and that you would have to wait until the Pay Board produced its report in June?

The reaction from the members was one of total disbelief and anger. They couldn't believe that a Labour Employment Secretary would take this position.

Why do you think he refused to sanction the claim?

Because he knows that to concede our claim would mean that this would lead to even greater pressure for similar treatment from sections such as the teachers, tube workers, banking staffs etc who are also feeling the pinch.

This attitude of Foot has only served to antagonise the members and this has pushed them towards adopting a militant position. You have to remember that Local Government White Collar workers have a long history of non-militancy. The situation in Wandsworth now is that I am getting repeated requests from many departments, particularly from the lower paid members for strike action in order to force the issue. In fact since we started the overtime ban quite a number of former non-unionists have now joined NALGO.

Over 65% of NALGO members are earning less than £1600 gross pa (£31 a week). In Wandsworth the majority of the members are in the lower grades, ie Typists, Clerical workers etc. These workers face a desperate position in relation to rents, food prices, fares etc.

It is no accident that they are the most militant at this time. We have learnt that once the lower grade workers take action, like banning overtime, the borough virtually comes to a standstill.

•What is your attitude to selective strike action?

Personally I would have liked to have seen total strike action throughout London in order to achieve the claim. I estimate that over 50% of the members, particularly the low paid would also support this if it was explained to

I also firmly believe that only 100% trade union membership will provide the basis for real improvements in our wages and conditions. There must be thousands of workers in the Greater London, area who are not members of a trade

•I now asked Mick Lyne for his comments - Mick, what is the position with the manual workers. Do they stand to gain from the action of NALGO?

Yes! But the point is there has been no activity from the union leaders, as to what positive action should be taken. In fact a large number of manual workers do not realise that they are involved in this question?

• How do you mean?

Well, the following statement has not really been broadcasted by the union to the members. This applies to all manual workers in the 32 London boroughs.

The statement comes from a meeting held on 25 March between the union officials and the employers. It reads thus:

"As a result of this interim agreement (ie White Collar workers'), discussions have taken place on the question of the London allowance for Manual Workers at the Executive Committee of the Greater London Joint Council for Manual Workers held yesterday and we advise you that

the following decision was taken: Greater London Council Executive Committee for Manual Workers records its decision that with regard to the London Allowance, we will treat Manual Workers on an equitable basis in respect of the treatment secured for APT&C staff and also in regard to the operative date'."

John Hall: We will be taking selective strike action from April 17 in selective departments. We have set up a Campaign Committee to plan the strike and we have links with the other boroughs. At the moment there been no attempt by the individual Campaign Committees to link up in order to co-ordinate the action. This is being planned from the union headquarters.

Mick Lyne: I will be raising the whole question at my union branch in order to inform all the Manual Workers' Shop Stewards on the reality of the situation.

• Finally, John, what do you think will come out of the situation?

Closer unity between the Manual and White Collar workers. · Mick?

We should strive together - not separately - to improve the conditions of all Local Government workers.
