Readers in the Nottingham area might like to bear in mind that since THE WEEK commenced publication in its present printed form—the amount of assistance required has increased rather than decreased. There are two ways in which readers can help THE MEEK:

HANDBOOKS AND ADDRESSES.

Our list of addresses of left socialists throughout the country who have received sample copies of THE WEEK is very large and we are anxious to make it as comprehensive as possible. In addition to mailing sample copies, these addresses are needed for other purposes, such as the calling of a meeting in a particular town. Handbooks, published by Trades Councils and Regional Labour Parties are very useful, as are those published by such organisations as the local branches of Council for Social Services and Students' Unions. We will be very glad to receive such lists of addresses.

LIBRARIES.

A substantial number of libraries in all parts of the world subscribe to THE WEEK Such subscriptions are extremely useful and readers can assist by asking their local library to subscribe. A combined 'official' and personal approach is necessary in most cases. A random mailing of libraries results in a 2% response. Working with the co-operation of readers, this could be as much as 50%. Overseas readers can particularlry help in this respect by ensuring that a copy is received by their National Library and leading institutions for political study. It is likely that the British Council will subscribe (they maintian a large library of English Language books in every foreign capital) if personal requests are made. Keep us posted.
