The reformist theory that only adults, only parties, and not the youth or their organizations should meddle in politics, has turned out a flasco. The correctness of Lenin's contention that the youth plays an enormous role in the class strug-gle and that without organizational independence it cannot be trained in the spirit of struggle for social-iem has been confirmed fully and in the spirit of struggle for social-ism, has been confirmed fully and completely. The most revolutionary and active sections of the youth have realised that the split in the international youth movement plays into the hands of faction, the in-stigators of a new imperialist war and the enemies of the toiling nearth

If on the basis of Bolshevik self-criticism we disclose and eliminate all that hampers our unification of the youth in the struggle against fascism, in the interests of the all that hampers our unification of the youth in the struggle against fasciam, in the interests of the young toilers, that should all the more so be done by the Socialist youth. We must not regard our-selves as "choice" Socialists and voluntarily isolate ourselves from the millions of young toilers or-ganized in the Catholic and various bourgeois sport, cultural and even fascist youth organizations. We can-not confine ourselves merely to So-cialist propaganda. We must mobi-lize and be the organizers of the broad masses of youth in the strug-gle against fascism, for socialism, winning them over, in a stubborn fight, from the influence of the bourgeoiste and fascism. This mobi-lization and struggle can be suc-cessfully achieved on the basis of the united front. **Militants** Act In Minn. AFL Left Wing Forces Fight for Program at State Labor Convention

(Special to the Daily Worker) MINNEAPOLIS, Minn., Aug. 22.-The convention of the Minnesota State Federation of Labor, just ended here, disclosed a decided shift toward the left in the ranks of labor in spite of the steam roller tactics of the bureaudracy. This was the first time in recent years that left wing forces were present at the state convention and that a first developed on the deep

present at the state convention and that a fight developed on the floor on so many vital issues. The clash between the left wing and the reac-tionaries finally led to Pat. Corco-ran, vice-president of the Minne-apolis district of the A. F. of L. in a fit of temper physically attacking Hillard Smith, one of the militant delegates delegates.

More than eighty resolutions were introduced by the delegates. Among those that were passed was one demanding the freedom of Tom

demanding the freedom of Tom. Mooney. Another resolution passed demanded the trade union scale on all W. P. A. projects and called for support for the unemployed organ-izations and for further organiza-tion of the unemployed with the aid of the A. P. of L. After a bitter fight in which en-dorsement of Workers' Bull, H. R. 2827, was defeated, a resolution was passed calling for unemployment insurance in general. Another res-olution demanded the 30-hour week and the taking over of all closed industries by the government. **Tydings Bill Denounced**.

closed industries by the government. Tydings Bill Denounced Hitlerism was sharply denounced as was also the Tydings-McCormack "disaffection" bill. A resolution calling for the defense of Ethiopia was defeated by a substitute res-olution against war in general. The Marcantonio bill for Workers Rights was enforced was endorsed.

The convention voted to support the strike at the Strut-Wear knit-ting plant, and also, despite at-tempts to shelve the question, the strike in twelve ornamental iron works.


Local 574 of the Teamsters, whose charter was revoked by the inter-national office for its part in the militant strike last year, was re-fused the floor by a vote of 161 against 96.

A resolution calling for trans-forming the Farmer Labor Party into a party of struggle was refused

into a party of struggle was relused a hearing, but a motion was passed in favor of political parties sup-porting the demands of labor. Farmer Labor. Governor Lloyd B. Olson of Minnesota, who invoked martial law against the truck drivers' strike, was endorsed for the United States Senate.
