All Party Federations Condemn Breach of Discipline by Jewish Federation Bureau.

At a meeting of representatives of Language Sections of the Workers Party, elected by the Bureau of each section to represent its viewpoint, the following resolution was adopted:

The undersigned representatives of the Language Federations of the Workers Party having considered the action of the Jewish Bureau in violating the discipline of the Party and threatening to bring disruption into the Jewish Federation, and into the Workers Party, declare,

That we support the actions of the Central Executive Committee and the Administrative Council. We are of the opinion that the Central Executive Committee has acted in the interest of the Party in its negotiations with the Bureau of the Jewish Federation and that it has shown its earnest desire to preserve the unity of the Party, even at the sacrifice of its authority and the discipline of the organization.

We condemn the action of the Jewish Bureau and call upon it to at once accept the terms for adjustment of the controversy within the Jewish Federation laid down by the Administrative Council in its letter to the German Bureau.
