Among other things, Representative Berger said:

We seem headed toward precipitating a revolution in Mexico to overthrow the Calles government and substitute a reactionary government which would assure the property rights of American capitalists in Mexico.

Such a revolutionary movement is already definitely organized. It is generally directed by its leaders from the United States-Washington, Los Angeles and El Paso. American capitalists owning industries and land in Mexico are its principal supporters. Their candidate for the presidency is De la Huerta, now in the United States. His program is to suspend by military decrees the 1917 constitution, which is objectionable to the "interests," to substitute temporarily the 1857 constitution, and subsequently to call a new constitutional convention that will serve American vested property rights.

Lifting of arms embargo would precipitate that kind of a revolution. Mexican revolutionists already have some arms and munitions, most of which were smuggled from the United States. Sacasa also got his arms in this way from New York.

Regular war between the United States and Mexico is improbable. Naval and military forces would be used "to protect American interests" against "revolutionary chaos," and to help Huerta after he is recognized by the United States.
