WASHINGTON — An American merchant marine, operated by the government, is favored by the Senate Committee on Commerce in a report presented at the closing hours of Congress. Many government ships from service clearly in the interest of gouging private corporations. The committee points out the fol-lowing advantages that would flow from the passage of its government-
