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Story of A Tenant Farmer

An Amazing Situation Brought to Light by the Appeal Investigation

ATTENTION, three and one-half million tenant farmers of America. Here is something for you to consider. A part of your number living in Dunklin county, Mo., could no longer endure the conditions imposed upon them by their landlords.

On account of the stumps and trees only the most primitive tools can be used and most of the cultivating has to be done with hoes and single plows.

Most of the men try to add a little to their income by renting more land than they can work and hiring a little help.

Here is the record of three families living on the same farm: Oscar Dodd rented fifty acres for 1911 and paid \$3 per acre for it.

Henry Tarno rented 40 acres at \$8.50 per acre and has an unpaid store account of \$350. Tarno has a wife and four children ranging from eleven years of age down to one year.

There was in 1910, according to the government census report, 1,935 tenant farmers in Dunklin county and the above mentioned families are just averages.

This left many farmers face to face with starvation. They had already signed notes and contracts agreeing to pay \$8.50 and \$10 per acre and their landlords would not stand as guarantors for groceries and other supplies.

This was more than the landlords could stand and so they used their political power to crush the tenants and break up their organization.

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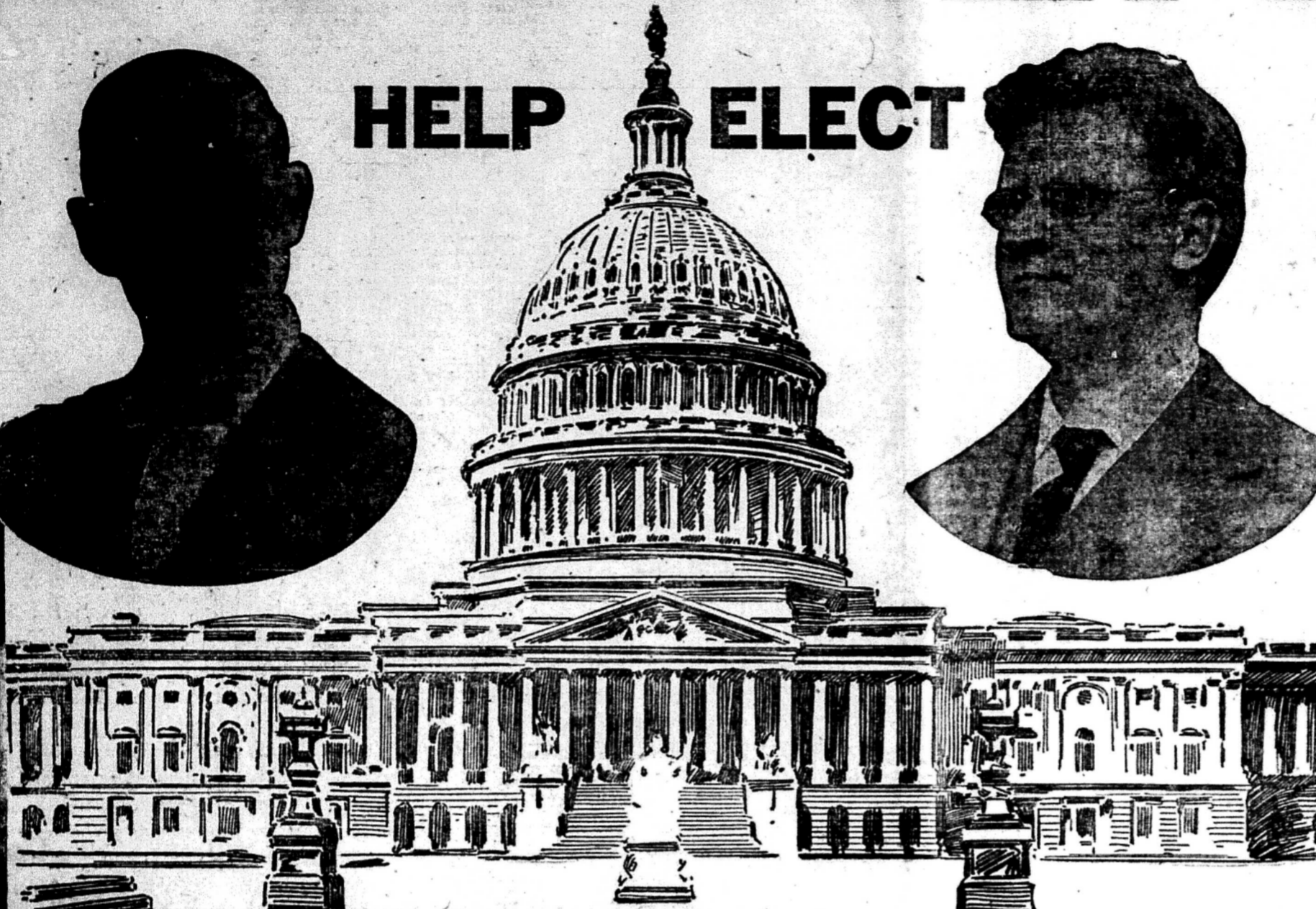
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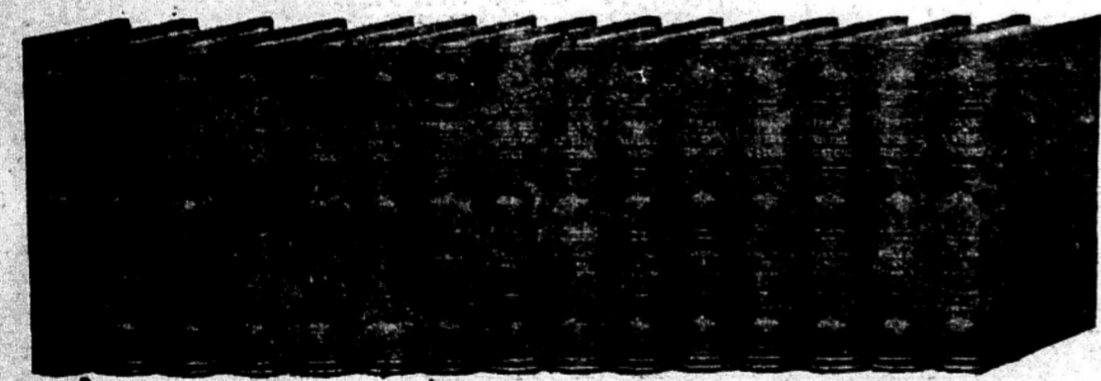
