## THE 1912 CAMPAIGN

THE 1912 CAMPAIGN

The campaign of 1912 will be a memorable one in history and one which will long be remembered by Socialists of the future. It marks the development of the Socialist party from what might be called the "seet" stage into the era of Socialism as a political force. The size of the Socialist vote in 1912 will undoubtedly hasten the day when the old parties combine against us. The combination of the two—or rather the four—for the Prohibition and the Independence League, may both be said to be of the same stock as the Democrats and Republicans—is devoutly to be hoped for by the working class. The Socialist party enters the campaign of 1912, full of enthusiasm and sure of its ground. It is the only party which "knows where it is at" and holds its position, safe and serven in the consciousness of its evolutionary necessity and its ultimate triumph.

Predictions as to the total vote of the Socialist party are seldom profitable and never in good taste. We do not seek to win votes, but to educate the working class. The Socialist vote may be rightly considered as the index to the degree of class-conscious education among the working class.
