GRAND JURY VERY EASY WITH CITIZENS' ALLIANCE

Calamet, Mich. - The chief event in the strike zone during the past few days has been the withdrawal of the Citizens' Alliance by the Grand Jury. Returning five no true bills and one secret indictment for felony, the Grand Jury denounced seventeen business men and others of the charge of assaulting Charles H. Meyer, president of the Western Federation of Miners, with intent to do great bodily harm less than the crime of murder.

The verdict virtually whitewashes the Citizens' Alliance, the organization of small business men and strong arm men which has been terrorizing the district with the hope of breaking up the miners' union and driving the strikers back into the copper barons' shafts.

For several days past Nicholls has been giving out statements to the effect that, if Meyer and the six other indicted officials who have not been arrested do not return to Houghton County, extradition proceedings would be instituted, the coverage the impression that the seven officials were fleeing trial - an impression which has been taken advantage of by the entire capitalist press of the nation.
