Ruthenberg, a Communist, victim of the "law and order" of American capitalism's white terror, will breakfast alone in his cell in the Berrien county jail, at St. Joseph, Mich.

The White House discussion will not be directed toward effecting a sane regime of real "law and order" in these United States. It will merely take up the problem of fighting the enemies of the capitalist class, whether it is the poor and starving mother, who steals a load of bread to feed her children, or the Communist who unites with his comrades in the growing vanguard of labor's militant army fighting for all power. Capitalism must be protected against the Ruthenbergs.
