WASHINGTON CONFESSES PARIS PACT DRAWING U.S. INTO DAWES PLAN CHANGED AFTER SIGNING

WASHINGTON, Feb. 9.—Official admission was made by the state department today that certain textual changes were made in the Paris agreement, under which the United States became an official partner in the Dawes plan in exchange for 2½ all signed at Paris by Ambassador Kellegg and the allied representatives.

These changes, however, were of "little consequence." It was said at the department, and changed neither the context nor the utilimate purpose of the agreement.

After the agreement was signed, the state department explained, it was found that certain "obvious errors" were contained in the language, whereupon the delegates re-assembled and agreed upon a protocol to correct these errors. The second meeting was hedged about with considerable secrecy, and it was only a few days ago that press dispatches from abroad tobs.
