KING'S AMNESTY A RUSE TO FREE FASCIST HITTERS

Pope Is "Surprised" at Mussolini's Marders

(Special to The Daily Worker)
Rome, Italy, August 26.—The apostle of peace and brotherly love, Pope Pius XII, has been surprised to find that the minister of Justice, Francesco, is not only refusing to pardon the fascist hitlers, but is also ordering the arrest of all the fascist hitlers, including many Communist, from the prison houses. The pope's surprise is that the fascist party has the power to release whom it pleases, and only fascists jailed for murder and other crimes will be freed, it is expected.

The entire question is focusing its attention on "Palermo, where the municipal elections are scheduled to be held many votes the fascist vote can secure.

The pope's attitude is explained in the actual official paper, *Osse*. Rocco, the minister of Justice, has been ordered to pardon the fascist hitlers, including many Communist, from the prison houses. The Catholic official blames the violence of Fascism on the "fascist party who openly avow their violence, and in a recent speech advised ministers to meet peacefully" for the attack on the catholic.
