PARIS, Oct. 27.—(Special to the Daily Worker)

The League of Nations and the Locarno pact were expressed in the secret session of the league of nations conference now being held in Paris to decide the Greco-Bulgarian dispute, following which the League handed the representatives of Greece and Bulgaria, the League's decision that Greece and Bulgaria issue orders within twenty-four hours to their respective commanders to immediately begin the evacuation of occupied territory, and that all troops must be withdrawn from the territory within 60 days.

Article 18 of the League of Nations provides that the League shall take such steps as may be necessary to bring about a settlement of the dispute.

The League's decision was met with surprise and concern in both Greece and Bulgaria.

In one of the worst slum restaurants we Greek workers work long hours for very low wages.

That is a day's work itself and then a quarter bushel of onions, carrots, celery, like extra pot and cans to be washed.

Somehow they are so tired that when the chef calls them to get out they go exhausted, they can't eat food or rest as usual, because, when dinner (which is only 15 minutes to wait) is going, too most of these poor souls get sick.

When they get through with the work they start with the busy period which they get at 6:30 or 7:00 a. m., according to shift.

They have done good business, but the bosses are still kicking because they are not making as much during the war when they should be money!

For a day or Tuesday, but we were had to wait till Thursday night (which was miserable) until the boss was out for a good time with a lady. When he came back to the shop he didn't excuse himself for the delay, although one of the workers said he had had some work and had to work home because he didn't have carfare.

Now here are the conditions in Greek restaurants. Why? Because of lack of organization and understanding among Greek workers.

One question inevitably arises: Is the Amalgamated Bank so closely tied up with banking houses that it must follow the union fight for the bank and its efforts to bring the bank to a smashing policy of capitalism? And, if so, how long will it be before it will be used against the interests of the very union that created it?

The membership would do well to start an investigation of the motive behind this anti-union drive.

Make the Coal Strike Effective
The Progressive Miners' Committee has issued an open letter to John L. Lewis, that if adopted, will make the strike the arbiter of the fate of the coal industry. The letter demands that the maintenance demands be made the strike-effective by bringing out the standing men, whom Lewis now permits to stay in the mines and sell their coal in order to keep the industry from being damaged through neglect.
