The American delegation was composed of two groups at the time the Congress was called. One was the National Peace Council with Nevin Savre as chairman, the other was the American League Against War and Fascism with Harry F. Ward as chairman. In the prelimi-nary meeting before the official opening of the Congress, it was decided to unite the two American groups for the duration of the Congress only, with the two chairment acting as co-chairmen.
