IN PRISON WITH HERVÉ

THE gloomiest spot I saw in Paris was the Prison of the Saint. It was there I met Gustave Hervé, editor of *La Guerre Sociale*, author of "My Country Right or Wrong." To meet Hervé and other advanced thinkers was my principal mission in France.

Access to the prison where the doughty champion of labor is confined, was gained with little more trouble or red tape than

necessary to visit a jail in this country.

On my return from Italy, Comrade Charles Marck, treasurer of the Confederation of Labor, met me at the depot. We went direct to the Palace of Justice, and got the needed passes to the prison from the judge of instruction. We drove direct to jail. The approach to one of these institutions has a most depressing and indescribable effect even upon a visitor.
