ROBERT L. OWEN.

We had the pleasure of hearing Hon. Robert L. Owen speak last Tuesday morning. The state convention of the Socialist party at Oklahoma City, on the 11th and 12th was attended by fifty comrades from practically all portions of the state. It was one of the most interesting and instructive conventions we have ever held, and the enthusiasm was contagious.

Toler, Muldrow; Chief Mine Inspector, David Henderson, Etowah; Corporation Commissioner, E. C. DeBerry, Hewitt; Roy Hayes, Coyle; H. P. Reeves, Perry; Justices of the Supreme Court, D. H. Denman, Cleo and A. S. Loueermilk, El Reno, from their representative districts, the other three districts were left open. Clerk of the Supreme Court, J. D. Kolachny, Ft. Cobb; Agricultural Com. S. F. Edwards, Agusta; A. McArthur, Beaver; John P. Block, Lookaba; R. Mashke, Kingfisher; L. N. Thomson, Roll; W. A. Barnes, Etowah; W. M. Hathway, Weleetka; Wm. Hayman, Castle; J. W. Hayes, Durant; I. N. Johnson, Dosey, M. M. Heffner. The preference of the party for U. S. Senators was expressed by naming for those positions W. E. Jennings, Woodward, I. T. and H. M. Coon, Durant, I. T.

Resolutions were adopted congratulating the socialists of all nations on the growth of the socialist movement; extending sympathy to the comrades in Idaho, commending the labor organizations for their immediate and hearty response to the call for assistance from Colorado and Idaho; expressing sympathy with the hopes and aims of organized labor; urging greater individual and we collect effort on the part of the comrades to extend our propaganda; and urging women of Oklahoma to work in both industrial and political organizations. The convention adjourned subject to the call of the state committee to convene if future developments make it necessary.

ARTICLE 10 OF THE CONSTITUTION

The Duncan Banner quotes the constitution to the effect that taxation is limited to thirty and one-half mills.

Here is the way the constitution reads:

Sec. 2. "The legislature shall provide by law for an annual tax sufficient with other resources to defray expenses of the state for each fiscal year.

You see there is really no limit.

Sec. 3. Provides for increasing the tax.

Sec. 4. Provides for more taxes.

Sec. 5. Expenses, democratic lunacy. It calls for what is impossible uniform taxation.

Sec. 6. Provides for exemptions.

Sec. 7. Provides for special taxation with the consent of the legislation.

Sec. 8. Then comes in it reads, "Except otherwise provided."

I looked the matter up because I knew the Banner was trying to deceive the farmer.

When Roosevelt says, "Your a liar," he must have reference to the Banner.

Sec. 9. Divides the 32½ miles and provides for more special taxes.

Sec. 10. Also provides for more taxes.

Sec. 11. defines for a multitude of additional taxes.

Sec. 13. Enlarges the taxing power of the state.

Sec. 14. Provides for more taxes to carry into effect section 31 of the bill of rights.

Sec. 15. Refers to the pledging of the credit of the state.

Sec. 16. Refuses the use of borrowed money.

17. 17. Refers to power conferred upon counties, cities, etc., in regard to taking stock in corporations, etc.

Sec. 18. Provides for the beneficent poll tax of \$2.00. This tax is rising. It will reach \$10.00 in course of time.

Sec. 19. Has to do with lowering taxes.

Sec. 20. Refers to enactment of more laws for the levying of taxes.

Sec. 21. Provides for equalizations boards.

Sec. 22. Provides for a general multiplication of taxes, means and methods. And then they changed from taxes to dept. Now was not that an appropriate change.

Section 7 appears to be lowded for bear. But Duncan could not take advantage of that section without the consent of the legislative and as all legislatures are made up of grafters and boodlers. It is hardly likely to ever be more than a dead-letter or be construed in the interest of landlords and speculators.

Section Seven seemingly provided for taxing property the value whice is increased by public improvements. If this provision was made to bear upon Duncan property the entire east of the court house and ail other public improvement would be assessed against the townsite.
