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A Very Childish Democratic Doctrine

One element of the democratic party styles itself "the safe and sane democracy. That is as much as to say that the other is a fit and proper subject for an asylum. The free coinage idea is fully equalled in imbecility by the proposition to restrict the ownership of land to 160 acres. And the free coinage idea was the craziest notion that ever emanated from a childish mind. The application of this latest democratic theory would bring agricultural progress to a standstill. The self-binder and the steam plow, not to mention the drill, would be practically worthless, as these machines cannot be worked to advantage on as small an area as 160 acres. Not many quarter sections are capable of yielding 160 acres of tillable land—in fact the average 160 acres in one body will not yield more than 160 acres fit for cultivation. Restricting the individual's operations to 160 acres of land would most assuredly make bread and meat cost the people at large a great deal more than it does now. It would also render the work of the inventor of no service to agriculture. It would constitute a long step backward towards the day of the cradle and the flail.

The only reason the advocate of this barbarous method can give to justify his theory is that it would reduce the number of tenants and of course increase the number of landowners. He seems to labor under the impression that the ownership of land is essential to the welfare of the individual. This impression in connection with all other democratic impressions is altogether false. Secure to the individual an equitable share of the annual product and it makes no difference whatever to him whether he owns land or not. How much land is owned by the average merchant of Duncan? Or the average preacher, or the average clerk, or the factory operative?

We know that their well-being does not depend upon the ownership of land. But it does depend upon their receiving an equitable share of the annual product. It is the inequitable distribution of the annual product serves to impoverish the tenant farmer, and not the monopolization of the agricultural land. Therefore, a more equal distribution of farming land would not have even a tendency to improve the condition of the tenant farmers as a whole, while on the other hand it certainly would make barbarism.

That government is best which lets the individual paddle his own boat. All this restraining of the individual makes for despotism, and democratic despotism is the most tyrannous and oppressive of all. The best political doctrine that was ever taught is: "Hands off the individual, and turn him loose."

There is no real scarcity of land, never was and never will be. It is good common sense and political intelligence that is scarce. Ten thousand families can draw support from one acre of town land through the medium of a factory. Millions of acres of land are lying idle in the towns and cities of the United

States. Our method of raising revenue encourages speculation in these millions of acres. A few acres of mineral land will give profitable employment to a vast number of men. Here again our method of raising revenue encourages speculators to hold these acres idle. Population is therefore driven to the cheapest land for support—that is, agricultural land. This pressure of population gives agricultural land a value it would not otherwise have. The speculator grabs it for the rent it will field. And so an impoverished tenantry is the natural consequence. The true remedy is simple enough. The state must be made to draw its revenue directly from the value that attaches to town sites and mineral land. This will compell use and destroy speculation. Population will be drawn off the agricultural land and its value will disappear. It can then be had for the taking and the tenant may become a land owner if he so desires. In other words give us freedom of domestic trade and turn the individual loose. Reap the that attaches to the ground for revenue and thereby destroy speculation in town lots, farm lands and mineral lands. This is the only true remedy for the impoverishment of the tenant farmer. This is the fundamental principle of Socialism. This remedy will eliminate the landlord and speculator. It is the first and essential step towards the equitable distribution of the annual product. The value of the ground belongs to the state.

Suffrage for Foreign Women

The good example of Finland has been followed by Norway, which has just granted suffrage to its women on the same conditions which prevail with regard to municipal suffrage; namely, that women themselves or their husbands, in order to be entitled to vote, must have paid taxes for a year. The new law gives the suffrage to all women 25 years old, taxed on an income enjoyed by themselves or their husbands of \$113 in cities and \$84 in the country. It creates a total of 300,000 women voters.

It is not often that it is given to women suffragists to see such swift results of their labors. The first woman suffrage society was organized in Christiana in 1885, the National Woman Suffrage Association of Norway not until 1898. Tax-paying women were given the municipal suffrage in 1901; now comes this further extension of the franchise, and there have been many minor victories of real importance.—Oklahoma Woman Suffragists Oklahoma City, O. T.
