Jeff Hines Acquitted

The case of Jeff Hines vs. the Unites was tried last Wednesday in the commissioners court at Duncan. Hines was charged with having assaulted C. H. Riviere with a deadly weapon in the post office on the 8th day of July. There has been a great deal of interest manifested in this case inasmuch as this was the second trial. The first trial resulted in a hung jury standing 4 to 2 for conviction for aggravated assault. The testimony developed the fact that Jeff's mother had a residence rented from Mr. Riviere which was not insured but the household goods were insured, and the house burned down. Cap Woodward a nephew of Mrs. Hines swore that Mr. Riviere told him that some of the Hines family set it on fire and then Cap told Mrs. Hines what Riviere said. Mrs. Hines swore that she told Jeff that Mr. Riviere had circulated the report that they had burned the house also that she passed her husband from whom she was separated off as her cousin and had kept him a couple of days all of which was a gross libel. Jeff swore in his own behalf that his mother told him all this, and that a day or so later when he was going to the post office he saw Mr. Riviere turn the corner also going to the post office and that he went on down and seeing a boy pull a stick up out of the window of the post office he went down and armed himself with it and followed Mr. Riviere in the post office and walked up to him and with both hands hit him on the head and after he fell hit him another lick and he was pulled off and as he was being pulled out of the room he said to Mr. Riviere I guess you know what I hit you for. Mr. Riviere denied that he had made any slanderous statements about Mrs. Hines, but that does not make a particle of difference in this land where the unwritten law predominates whether he made the remarks or not so long as the boy believes he made them strong enough to arouse his passions he has a perfect right to knock his block off and inquire into the matter later on.

The True Paramount Issue

Keep the fact ever before your mind Mr. producer that what you want is an equitable distribution of the annual product amongst the producers. You will do well to remember that the annual product is the result of co-operative efforts. Your product is only a small contribution as it were to the sum total of things that constitutes your living. Your living is your share of the annual product. Is it an equitable share? Is it equal to your contributions? The right to produce should be free and untrammelled and there should be no restrictions on the right to trade because we must produce and trade the product in order to live. Whatever impairs your right to produce or your right to trade must necessarily impair your right to live. Landlords and speculators are not producers. The sum of the annual product that goes to them belongs to those who helped to produce it.

The profits of town lot speculation is so much filched from those who produce the wealth. The political party that would truly serve the farmer will consider the question of freedom of domestic trade as of paramount importance. There is no other question of any importance whatever compared with this.

When taxation as we now know it is abolished trade will be free and not before, for revenue will then be drawn directly from the value of the ground and speculation in town lots, mineral and farm lands will be impossible because the incentive will be taken for the benefit of the public.

Haywood and Moyer may consider themselves in good luck. It is not often that two sets of state authorities, the railroad companies, the supreme court with the presidents approval can enter into a conspiracy to kidnap and convey the victims of the conspiracy to a point where everything is previously fixed to hang them fails to accomplish the desired end. It won't fail the next time, for the case won't be left to a jury. Ways and means will be found to set aside the jury and give the victim a short shrift.

The Idaho case proves that farmers cannot be depended upon in a case when labor is pitted against the corporations. Gov. Goodings venomous mouthings since the trial bodes ill for organized labor in Idaho. The farmers and wage workers must join hands at the ballot box and demand that the value of mineral land and town lots be reaped for the public benefit, and thereby destroy speculation in both mineral land and town lots. The worker both in store, factory and farm must develop enough political intelligence to enable them to distinguish the man who helps to develop industry from the speculator who works to restrict its development, and profits by so doing.

The Latest Democratic Infamy

The insurance law of Texas is altogether infamous. It is based on the policy of creating a market for worthless securities, it serves to enhance the value of certain securities over and above the value such securities would naturally have. It seeks to do for securities in general what the National banking art done for the government bond, that is, it serves to create an artificial market, and as the speculator says it serves to keep Texas money in Texas. "Keeping Texas money in Texas" would never incite the speculator to action along this line. Making a market for the product of rascality and knavery, a worthless piece of paper, is the real incentive. This law is essentially democratic. The democratic party is essentially the party of inflation and speculation. That is the reason why it is the mother of panics.

All the idiotic ideas in regard to money have sprung from the foolish doctrines taught by the democratic politician. Populism is simply the child of the democratic party and its crazy notions about finance are all democratic and are based upon the stupid theory that money creates commerce. Money is simply an order on the market at large. Nothing more and nothing less, money is all redeemable. It is redeemed when the individual spends it. The money in Texas constitutes an order on the Texas market if it is drawn away in payment for service. Insurance for instance, it becomes an order on some other market and when used serves to reduce the supply of actual wealth in that market. The drawing away of money serves to leave the supply of wealth intact in the local market, and is equivalent to increasing the supply.

Other things being equal the cost of living will be that much lower as the cost of living is based upon the supply, the greater the supply the lower the cost of living. Money is merely an order upon the market for a part of the supply.

The politician of Texas has arranged a plan whereby the speculator in securities can sell his paper to the insurance company in exchange for an order on the market paid to the company by policy holders of Texas. This enables the speculator to draw actual wealth from the market in return for what may be a worthless piece of paper. The Texas insurance law is essentially democratic and it is the principal involved that renders the democratic party an unmitigated curse to the country and the mother of panics.

New York, Aug. 7.—In a Korean imperial decree dooming him to the severest punishment for his anti-Japanese mission to The Hague, Prince Yi of the Hermit Kingdom sees a respite rather than a death sentence.

"I shall die, of course," he said calmly, repeating his assertion in an interview immediately following his landing in New York a week ago to start a campaign for American intervention to save his country from Japanization, "but the decree may mean that I am not to be assassinated in this country, but will be permitted to return to my native country to meet my end."

The order to punish Prince Yi and his companion, the former second Korean prince, bears the signature of the deposed emperor, the prince's grand-father, and is dated some time prior to the latter's abdication.

"It is of Japanese origin," continued the prince, "and the emperor was forced to sign it. The minister of justice, who is instructed to punish us, is Cho Choong Fung, the Korean arch-traitor, who first signed the so-called treaty with Japan, selling his country for gold. There is no question that he will execute the order against us, and with the approval of the Japanese."

"I shall return home nevertheless. First I shall visit Russia to see my family. When I am satisfied I have done all in my power to aid my country, I shall go there prepared to meet my fate."
