The State Socialist Paper of Arkansas too Hot For Plutes and Grafters Burned While Editor was away From the City.

Silom Springs, Ark., Aug. 12th.

Dear Comrades—

On May 9th I started a weekly Socialist paper in this city at 50 cents per year. It was most too hot for the plutes and grafters from the first and after the third issue was out they told the party who was printing The Fair Deal to cut it out and he did so, breaking the contract that he had entered into to print the paper for a year.

The mayor and other influential men went to my advertisers and shut off all the best ones. I had the paper printed in another city till it could get a plant of its own.

They used every means possible to keep it out of second class mail, and had it not been for an influential Republican friend who is a man every inch it would not have been entered.

I had not calculated on having to buy a plant for a year, but this turn compelled me to do so. I took what money I had, mortgaged my home for more and bought a very good plant for newspaper and job work and installed it July 11th.

On July 24th the Socialist party of the state endorsed The Fair Deal as the State Socialist paper. Though it had worked under all disadvantages which can be heaped upon a Socialist paper, its subscription list had passed eleven hundred and was still climbing nicely.

Its job department was turning out excellent work and The Fair Deal was just getting on a paying basis with its subscription list rising nicely.

On August 5th my family and Comrade Ostraus and others planned to go fishing the following Saturday evening, August 10th. We left town about six o'clock to go to the river about seven miles away. At midnight we heard the fire whistle. When we returned the next day we found The Fair Deal plant and the Elite Studio, which also belonged to the editor in ashes.

Now what shall we do? Shall we surrender, I am crippled financially, but still in the fight and am having The Fair Deal printed away from home till I can get another plant.

We know no defeat. We are in the fight to death. We are going to replace this plant and The Fair Deal is going to live in spite of fire or high water. How much are you in on this matter? Of course, under capitalism, where profit is the main thing, abuses are bound to be as thick as thistles, but that is all the more reason why the people must get control of government and begin the work of getting things right. And don't stick your fingers in your ears and cry that's "politics." Don't be prejudiced, for prejudice is weakness. You will find that a good many more things are politics than you have ever dreamed of before you get through and and that you have been the worst sufferer from the result of your prejudices. Of course it is politics, end you ought to be mighty glad that it is, for it means that the chance is there to get matters straightened out if you want to do it.

We glory in the spirit of the Smithfield martyr who endeavored to cheer his fellow sufferer with the admonitions. "Act the man master Ridley, act the man. What man can think of it and not feel proud of the fact that he is one of the race." Of such stuff is the socialist formed.

The Ways We Are Robbed

The actual wealth producer is robbed more ways than one. By the imposition of taxes is one and the principal way, by the issuance of money is another, and by the creation of artificial market for paper securities is another. There is at least one instance on record where the producers were ruthlessly robbed by creating an artificial market for one of the metallic products. Silver, this was accomplished by the Sherman purchasing act. In every case the politician is in collusion with the beneficiaries. No robbery of the producer can be perpetrated without the aid and sanction of the Politician. He permits the corporation to rob Tom, Dick and Harry by granting it the power to exercise the function of the state and then compels the corporation to divide the swag with him. The politician takes all the traffic will bear from the farmer. He then impowers the corporation to take all the traffic will bear. He then compels the corporation to divide its share of the swag with himself. The farmer gets it in the neck by both politician and corporation.

Popular economic ignorance is at the bottom of all the robbery. Ignorance of the fact that all wealth is the result of co-operative efforts and that the market is a large common storehouse into which everyone puts his product, ignorance of the fact that money is nothing more than an order on the keeper of the storehouse for its face value of the stock, ignorance of the fact that the issuance of an order on the storehouse where no service has been rendered that would entitle the holder to a share of the stock that constitutes robbery, the politician takes advantage of all this ignorance and ruthlessly and shamefully robs the common storehouse.

There is no material difference between depositing a bale of cotton in the market and receiving 50 dollars for it and then depositing the 50 dollars in the bank and receiving a certificate of deposit. Who ever robs the bank robs me and who ever robs the market robs me also.

Get wise to the nature of money and then get wise to the operations of the politician and you will find that he is nothing more than a common thief and the producer is the victim of his shupendous villiany.

Suppose for the sake of argument that Stephens county contained no more than five men, and suppose that one third of the arie of the county was in use and owned by a landlord, and suppose that all the rest of the county was owned by a speculator, and suppose that one of the five worked all the land in use as a tenant, and suppose that another furnished the tenant with tools to work the land with, and then suppose that the fifth man takes so much of the product and converts it into common conveniences, and in this way increases the sum of the product that the workers must give the landlord for the right to work. In what would the condition of the worker differ from what it is just at the present time. The more of the product converted into public conveniences the more of the product the landlord gets. Multiply the five men by a number that will yield a product equal to the present population and you have everything just as it is.

This demonstration goes to show that taxation serves to enrich the landlord it also serves to impoverish the worker. There is no way known to man whereby we can enrich the landlord without robbing the worker.

PROHIBITION!

IS IT A PANACEA FOR ALL ILLS. IS
EARNESTNESS A SIGN OF INTELLECT. ASK
YOURSELF THE QUESTION.

The prohibitionists are turning over heaven and earth in a desperate effort to prevent that hydra-headed monster rum from fastening his murderous fangs in the new common wealth of Oklahoma. I can't concisely offer up an excuse for that brothel poorhouse and penitentiary populator. For every moment's pleasure it has afforded, it has produced years of anguish and despair for every heart it has gladdened it has thrown some heart-broken widow on her own resources to scratch out a measly existence for her ill-clad and sad-hearted self and unfortunate children. If the noble hearted, but short sighted prohibitionists would join with the Socialists in taking over the great industries of the land that are now engaged in the well organized business of grinding out millionaires and criminals at one end of the system and paupers and criminals at the other, and help us organize and industrial government wherein every man could get the full product of his labor and hours shortened until the able bodied could secure honorable employment. The incentive to commit crime would be almost wholly eliminated.

When the U. S. Government put revenue on whiskey she shoved the staff of the stars and stripes into the hip pocket of the devil. When the prohibition party gets control of the government they will find that their task has just begun. When they pass a law prohibiting the making or selling of intoxicating liquor the people whose living depends on the making and selling of liquor will not quietly lie down and starve for there must positively be some other avocation for them to take up in order to make the wherewith to keep soul and body together. The very word competition means to fight, and as long as there is an unceasing fight for the means of subsistence there will be an unquenchable desire for stimulants to nerve frail man up for the murderous fight.

The U. S. Army stands today an awful example of what ignorant meddlers will do when they get hold of something they don't understand. The U. S. Army post canteen was in the eyes of the W. C. T. U a great big hell hole of vice and debauchery wherein the young hero's of fair Columbo purchased through tickets to hell. But having been in the army when the canteen was abolished I happen to know the effect the abolition of the canteen had on the soldier and the love it engendered in the hearts of the soldier for the W. C. T. U. The canteen was run for the benefit of the soldiers and not for profit for private individuals, and a more orderly place of amusement was never conducted anywhere. All kinds of lunch, confectioneries and stationery was sold, also beer, but nothing stronger was sold. When the soldier was deprived of his practically harmless glass of beer he sneaked out at night hell bent on recreation to the nearest town and filled his patriotic hide with booze that would broil one of Thomases porterhouse in January. He would then arm himself with a couple of gallons of that frog-fight-a-snake and make his way back to the post just a few yards ahead of some drunken cop who got elected by the booze balance, he would then proceed to show his fellows a short road to glory. I say and can prove it by everybody that knows that there has been ten drunk soldiers since the W. C. T. U. won their crowning victory to where there was one before. There are thousands of young men today who owe their blasted hopes and wrecked lives to the ignorance of the W. C. T. U.

I am not trying to discourage the temperance element. In New Zealand it is said there is not a millionaire, pauper, saloon, bawdy house nor a prison. What is the reason? Economic independence and nothing more. Study economic determinism my Christian friends and learn what you undertook when you tried to keep an effect from following a cause.

The democratic candidate has opened the campaign for governor, in the course of his address he has the following to say about farming. "Realizing that the agricultural resources of our State are the principle basis of our prosperity, that the tiller of the soil furnishes the chief source of wealth. The most important industry to life and commerce of the State of Oklahoma, and that this class must be protected against the imposition of any who would prey upon their legimentible rights" realizing that it is not sufficient to point to the fact that wheat is worth \$1 per bushel on the market, or cotton 10 cents per pound, unless a fair proportion of these values occur to him.

Who produces the wheat and cotton? It is a false pride in our nation to point to market values that may be above the ordinary, unless we can also point to the fact that he who creates that value may justly share therein. That is a very nice lot of meaningless buncoe to give the farmer.

Suppose Mr Haskell were to tell us something about the causes that operate to force the cost of living above the return to production, and then give us a remedy, would that not be more to the point? The value of the farmers product is and always must be determined by the market, and every other value should be determined in the same place and in the same way. The market ought to be free to all. No restrictions should be placed upon the right to sell, nor on the right to buy. And the tiller of the soil should not have to support landlords and speculators. The owner of the soil should be the tiller, and the tiller of the soil should be the owner. Mr Haskell's racket is meaningless rot. It is also democratic.

Mr Haskell recognizes the fact in a very heavy sort of way that the living of each is the result of the co-operative effort of all. That being the case there must be something radically wrong with our method of distribution, what is that wrong? Will someone please answer? What are the natural laws of distribution? 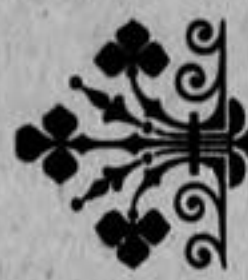
