## HOW TO RAISE REVENUE

Just at this time we are presented with an object lesson by the Republican and Democratic politicians, that if carefully investigated will reveal just exactly how the farmer is ruthlessly robbed by taxation.

With Statehood secured, Stephens County will be organized, and Duncan will be the county seat. This means an increased flow of business, a big increase in population, and the making of certain public improvements in Duncan at public expense. Public expense means at the expense of the farmers of Stephens County, the whole of the cost will come out of the value of the products of the farm. Bonds will be issued with the view of placing the bulk of the burden on the shoulders of the children who are now growing up, the interest will be paid by the wealth producers of the present.

Republicans figure that the cost of these public improvements will total for the county about \$400,000. They argue that this will constitute an unbearable burden to the farmers, because the bulk of the best agriculture land of the State is owned by Indians, and is therefore exempt from taxation. They might add that all the farmers on the reservations recently opened to settlement are under obligation to pay those same Indians immense sums of annual tribute for the right to live and work, and support the State of Oklahoma. This condition ought not to exist.

The carpet bag Republicans are the ones who brought it about. It was evidently the price they paid to secure the Indian vote. The constitutional convention was largely dominated by county seat grafters. And Statehood is not advocated by these grafters for the public good. This is the fact that the Republicans are trying to impress upon the public mind. On the other hand the grafters call attention to the fact, that the people outside of the towns are without educational facilities and illiteracy obtains to a frightful extent. Industrial development is held in check, and necessary public conveniences are woefully lacking. And this is all due to the want of local political organization in other words Statehood. The grafters endeavor to blind the people to the cost of those necessary conveniences by calling their attention to the constitutional limit to ad valorem taxation, while ignoring the exception clause to that provision. Oh! for some magic spell that would open the eyes of both Republicans and Democrats to the knavery and villianry of their unprincipled leaders.

Let us look at this matter from another point of view, and bring into line of visions facts ignored by both carpet baggers and grafters. The increase of population, and the making of county and munciple improvements in Duncan will increase the value of Duncan town lots at least \$100,000. Thus enriching the landlords and lot speculators in Duncan, this is the incentive that moves the grafter to action. Why should we, the wealth producers submit to such injustice? Why not impose a special tax upon the value

of Duncan town lots, and thus raise the required revenue with which to pay for those improvements? If the revenue is raised this way, the improvements won't cost anyone a cent.

The landlords and speculators will get it all back in the enhanced value of the lots. In the meantime, the landlords and speculators will still reap immense financial benefits from the making of those improvements. Why should we allow them to reap it all, while the cost is piled onto the shoulders of the wealth producers of the county? Go the grafters one better, and levy a special tax on the value of the lot exempting everything else. Why not charge the cost of those necessary improvements against the property benefited in accordance with Article 10, Sec. 7. of the constitution?

The courthouse and other improvements made in Lawton did not cost anyone a cent, those who bought the lots got all their money back and an immense profit into the bargain. Thats the way to raise revenue.

**THAT INJUNCTION SUIT**

The evidence is all in in the injunction suit wherein Dr. Howell filed an injunction against the Farmers Union to keep them from building a ware house on a lot adjoining some lots where he says he expects to build a five thousand dollar dwelling in case the Farmers Union don't build a ware house on their lots.

Now this is a pretty complicated affair for a poor inexperienced newspaper man to palaver about, especially in view of the fact that what ever he says somebody will say that he didn't know what in the devil he was talking about.

Now here goes for a meddlesome spell. these two pieces of real estate have been lying over there holding the community together for countless thousands of years practically valueless. The farmers gradually settled up this community and began to produce cotton and other commodities, they wanted to exchange these products for other commodities and that created a demand for merchants.
